

One of my pastor friends accepted a call to serve in Japan. His family adjusted well—except for his wife. On one of the few times she ventured out in Tokyo (by necessity), she got lost on the subway. She had no idea where she was; spoke and read no Japanese; and had no cell phone (not invented yet).

She finally found a pay phone and called her husband, but he couldn't figure out where she was either, increasing her panic to near hysteria. Her hubby told her to take our her passport, look at the gold eagle stamped there, and say (out-loud), 'This is who I am and this is only my temporary home.'

That was enough to calm her down while the pastor sent a member to find and get her. It was an experience she would never forget—or want to go through again. Needless to say, they moved back to the U.S. in a couple of months.

As we celebrate the 4th of July, we are again reminded of how blessed we are to live in such a great though far from perfect—country. Something to Think About How to Stay Safe


We've been hearing a lot about being safe lately. So, I did some research. If you want to remain completely out of harm's way, experts say you should avoid the following:

- Cars. 20% of all fatalities happen in vehicles
- Travel by airplanes, trains, boats and sidewalks. A full 30% of accidents involve these forms of transportation and that location
- Especially Hospitals. 32% of all deaths occur in hospitals
- Your Home. For all the encouragement to 'stay home, stay safe', 21% of accidents occur in your home (and I won't even include domestic violence).

On the other hand, I am particularly pleased to report that only .001% of all deaths and .03% of accidents occur in church or at Bible Study! Logically, the safest place you can be at any given point is at church or in Bible Study. (That assumes you didn't get into an accident on the way there). For safety's sake, attend church and Bible Class frequently. It could save your life—and think about what it will do for your eternal security! Just saying.
