

MAKING PANCAKES AND BREAKING CURFEW

Instead of getting up and watching cartoons while eating cereal as usual, six-year-old Brandon decided one Saturday morning to make his parents breakfast—their favorite, pancakes. So, having watched his Mom do it, he got out the big bowl and spoon and pulled a chair up to the counter. He went to the pantry and pulled out the heavy bag of flour, spilling it all over the floor. He scooped up as much as he thought he needed and put it in the bowl.

He got out three eggs, broke them open—more or less, shells are too small to matter he figured—and dumped in the milk that remained in his half-eaten cereal bowl. Sugar is always good (Brandon thought) so he put in a whole bunch of that. Even though some spilled, the dog enjoyed that. These would be the best pancakes his parents ever had!

Even though he was coated by the mix, he was beaming. But how much pancake mix should he put in the pan on the stove? And how do you turn on the stove? As he contemplated that, his dog tried to lick the batter. So he pushed the dog away—along with the rest of the eggs, some of the mix, and the pans he had gotten out.

Very soon after the crash, Brandon saw his Dad at the door. Tears welled up in his little eyes. He wanted to do something good, but he'd made a terrible mess. He was sure his Dad would yell at him and maybe even spank him. But, his Dad just walked through the mess, picked up his crying son and hugged him. Can you relate?

Or, maybe you can relate to Brandon's older brother Billy. Billy just turned 14 and began high school. There he found new friends with new ideas. Those ideas were opposite of what his parents had taught him. Question authority; whatever feels good, do it; you're old enough to make all your decisions. Smoking, cool. Alcohol, Oh yeah. Dirty magazines, sweet. Listening to your parents, no way. Church, boring.

Billy resented his parents and their rules. They were holding him back from having 'fun'. There was a party one night, but not the one Billy told his folks he was going to. He had an 11:00 curfew, but the party was too much fun—until the police showed up to cite everyone there for underage drinking.

The police called Billy's parents about 1:00 to have them come pick him up from the precinct. They were up worrying about him anyway. Billy thought his parents would really chew him out, ground him till he was 18 or take away his cell phone. But when Dad arrived, Billy received a hug and a 'I'm so glad you're OK'. Billy broke down and cried just like his brother.

That's how God deals with us. We try to do something good in life, but it often turns into a mess. Or we deliberately do something that we are forbidden and it harmful to us. The result is the same. God forgives us. That's not to say that God—nor Brandon and Billy's parents—don't care if we sin. All of them very much do.

It's just that God is love and wants all people to see their foolishness, sorrow over it, and receive his forgiveness. And life eternal in Heaven. When we are led to repentance (tears in this case), God picks us up and loves and forgives us. We've caused him grief and sadness, but he'll always love us.

Whether we sin intentionally or unintentionally, God wants us to come back to him. That's what the season of Lent is all about. God wants us to realize our sinfulness, repent of it, and receive the forgiveness Jesus offers us at his cross. "The blood of Jesus, God's Son, purifies us from all sin!" 1 John 1:7 Remember that fellow pancake makers and curfew breakers.

In John's day, as now, the message of a crucified Savior seemed out-of-step with what people thought/think they needed.

It's quite possible that, if given the chance, John would look at our present culture, smile, and say, "I've seen this all before." So the Lord led him to pen these words: "Who is it that overcomes the world? Only he who believes that Jesus is the Son of God." 1 John 5:5

By the time the Holy Spirit moved John to write his first letter, John was an old man. He had seen humanity's brokenness up close, and he had seen it many times over. He had seen the fickleness and restlessness of people's souls. He had seen their attempts to find meaning in pleasures, causes, philosophies, and belief systems that held no permanent meaning.

For John, only one thing rang true. For John, only one thing mattered. "Who is it that overcomes the world?" John asked. "Only he who believes that Jesus is the Son of God." He would put that in the 'some-things-never-change' category.

Down through the ages this message has continued to ring. It has continued to show our desperate need for forgiveness of sins and announce the full forgiveness we receive in the One named Jesus. Over the centuries, the message of the cross of Good Friday and the empty tomb of Easter has been proclaimed. And through this proclamation, generation after generation of souls have come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through faith in him we have life in his name.




