

Message from the Pastor

A QUESTION OF CHARACTER

Quick: what was the nickname the disciple Thomas has had ever since the first Easter? Doubting Thomas, right? As we get nearer to Easter, I will be talking about him. But for this newsletter, I'd like you to consider this statement he made earlier: ***Then Thomas said to the other disciples, "Let us also go that we may die with Him (Jesus)!"*** John 11:16.

Was Thomas unfairly judged by history? Was the Easter doubting an out-of-character comment? It doesn't seem fair to label someone on one event, does it? Nor would it be accurate to say that Thomas was the only disciple in that room who didn't expect to see Jesus again.

Indeed, there was more to Thomas than doubt. In the reading above, we see a very different Thomas. It wasn't Peter, James or even John who rallied to troops to Jesus' side. It was Thomas. Jesus had wanted to return to Judea to see his close friend Lazarus who had taken sick. The problem was, that on his last visit there, the Pharisees had tried to stone Jesus! To say he was a 'persona-non-grata' in the region was an understatement.

But, Jesus could not be persuaded to stay away. Jesus (and his disciples) knew the danger that probably awaited them there. Yet, that was all according to God's marvelous plan—but the disciples were not aware of it.

When it became evident that Jesus was dead-set (get it?) to go, it was Thomas who led the charge. ***"Let's go with Him that we may die with Him."*** That's a strong faith, is it not? Even if we have to die with Him, let's go guys. As Thomas sees it, his life belongs to Christ.

How much 'Thomas' do we have inside us? Or should I say, which part of Thomas lurks beating inside your heart? Death-defier or Doubter? Devoted or Dufus? Would you have said, 'Ok, let's get going' or 'Let's wait and see'? It's really a question of character, is it not? Commitment to Christ or Submission to Self?

“Commit your way unto the Lord; trust also in Him and He will bring it to pass” we read in Psalm 37:5. The reason we can have character and commitment, is that the Lord has committed himself to saving us from sin. He made the ultimate sacrifice. He died for us and rose again as Easter celebrates. Now he calls on us to rejoice and to get rid of doubt and guilt. Now he calls us to rejoice with him.

Faith in Jesus compelled Thomas to say, ‘I will die with you’. Can we have the same commitment to Jesus? Our whole lives should be dedicated to Christ. From the words we use, to the actions we take, and even the thoughts we have, we show our support for Jesus, or our doubt with his directions.

Thomas and the others found there was forgiveness with the Lord no matter how often they failed. Thomas’ doubting was not permanent. We will have doubts too along life’s path. And, we too are forgiven by the same loving Lord. We can express like Thomas did, **“My Lord and my God”** not only during Easter, but all year long. We can be devoted Thomases too.



Thomas is still urging ‘let us go with Him’. Will you gather—either on-line or in person—with fellow Thomases this Easter? Are your doubts holding you back? Listen to Thomas. Into which category will your name be placed? Character or Complacent; Doubt or Devotion?

Jesus is Risen indeed!
