

Message from Pastor

HOW MANY TIMES... HOW MANY WAYS... HOW MANY PEOPLE...... HAVE YOU THANKED?

Survey companies are always asking someone about something somewhere, right? I have found that to be true no matter what topic I'm talking about. This time, in the spirit of the month, it was 'thanks.' See how close you can come to the figures I found online.

How many <u>times</u> a day does the average American say 'Thank you'? The average was 14. How many times do you think you say thanks in an average day?

How many <u>ways</u> do you say thanks? The average was 4. Included in the count were using the actual words, doing something nice for someone else, buying them a gift and giving them a smile.

How many <u>people</u> did you thank today? The average was 6. Spouse was #1, family was #2, God was #3, co-workers were #4, workers at restaurants and stores was 5, and #6 was random people who crossed paths on the bus, in line and the like.

Another tidbit I found interesting was this: out of the approximately 200 countries in the world, only 8 have a national holiday for Thanksgiving. Those countries are USA, Canada, Germany, Grenada, Japan, Liberia, The Netherlands, and Norfolk Island (Australian territory). All except Germany and Grenada have gotten it from us something we should be proud of.

People usually find thanks to God flowing more freely during the 'Big Moments' of our lives. Good news from the doctor, getting a new job, finding that special someone, the birth of a child. But even then, do you find that you give yourself most of the credit, giving God vague credit? Do we thank God for everyday things like a house, food, safety, or love of others? Do you really express proper for God's daily care in so many ways? You know the answer. Ps. 106:6 confesses for us, **"We have sinned... we have done wrong and acted wickedly."** Even here we have something to be thankful for. "While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Rom. 5:8 No act of goodness or thankfulness or praise on our behalf motived the Lord to save our souls. It was purely out of love. We were helpless. "In my anguish, I cried to the Lord, and he answered by setting me free." Ps. 118:5.



Freedom. Is there anything more deserving of thanks? Jesus set us free from sin and death. We are able to hold our heads up before the eternal judge because we are free in Christ. Living in the freedom Jesus won for us means being thankful. Ps. 118:28 **"You are my God. I will give you thanks, for you**

are my God and I will exalt you." It's the perfect occasion to express gratitude in your heart for sins forgiven and the joy of eternal life. I hope you don't need to take a survey to realize that. Come join us any Sunday or on Thanksgiving eve to thank God.

My phone is full of pictures of moments that I thought were so very important. I have picture after picture of meals with friends, a beautiful view, or even selfies in a place I have never been before. Yet I must admit, I don't do much with these pictures. Many of them are great memories, but I rarely look at them. Few get printed out. Eventually, my phone tells me I am out of storage, so I end up deleting them in large groups.

The book of Ecclesiastes reminds us that so much of our life is like the pictures on our phone. Significant in the moment, but not so significant long-term. Yes, there is joy found in time spent with family and friends. There is good work to be done at our jobs, in our homes, communities, and churches. God has given us a beautiful and bountiful world, and he wants us to find satisfaction from that world.

The book of Ecclesiastes also confronts us with the truth that there is nothing permanently gained in much of our lives. Much of our life consists of things that are good for the moment but are soon gone. Like pictures on my phone, they are important for a while, and then they are soon forgotten and eventually gone.

Ecclesiastes instead invites you to find your meaning in things that truly last. Find meaning for your life in God's gracious Word to you in the love, forgiveness, and mercy he offers. Find meaning for your life in the work of Jesus that promises you a life to come that has no end.

So much of life is only for a short while. All of Jesus' work for you will last forever.

God In Nature

Many creatures have, what scientists call, the "wonder net." This is a special arrangement of blood vessels that certain animals need in order to conserve heat in their bodies.

A man standing with his bare feet in cold water would not survive long, but a wading bird can stand in cold water all day, and the whale and seal swim in the arctic with naked fins and flippers, continually bathing them in freezing water. All such warm-blooded creatures have to maintain a steady body temperature. How do they manage to do this?

They use what biologists call a "counter-current exchange." It is a method of heat exchange used in industry. In animals it is called "wonder net." The blood in one vessel flows in the opposite direction to that of an adjacent vessel, and in this way warm blood passes on its heat to the colder blood. It is equivalent to a double layer of circulating blood.

How did all those different animals, varying so widely from another, figure out how to do that? God planned it.


How Moses Crossed the Red Sea
