

Message from Pastor

I don't think there's more than a very few people who don't know the Grinch. Dr. Suess' Christmas classic in all its' cuteness (think Cindy-Lou Who) and rhyming charm (Every Who down in Whoville like Christmas a Lot - Except for the Grinch who certainly did Not!) is a fun family adventure... right?

The story goes on "How Grinch hated the feasting, the singing, the Noise So he dressed up like Santa and stole all their Toys." Can't you see poor Max, the dog, trying to lug the over-stuffed sleigh up the mountain? Then comes the 'Yeah!!' moment of the show as Grinch waits for the unison 'boo-hoo.' But instead, he hears "Every Who down in Whoville, the tall and the Small - was singing together with no presents at All. It came without ribbons. It came without tags - it came without ribbons or boxes or bags. It came - just the same. Maybe Christmas, he thought, doesn't come from a store - maybe Christmas perhaps means a whole lot more!"

Madison Avenue madmen try to make parents feel that unless their progeny have the latest iPhone, the coolest clothes, the most stylish shoes, they will be permanently scarred. Joy can only be found in joy-sticks. Relationships - phss. That's so Ozzie and Harriet or Brady Bunch. I'm trying to think of a modern one, but I can't! Doesn't that speak volumes?!

It's no wonder many people dread Christmas. Theirs will never be a Norman Rockwell picture.

Christmas can never be stolen from us when we, like the newly-enlightened Grinch, remember Christmas is about Jesus and him alone. The Whos had the right spirit. They were unfazed by having nothing at all. They still sang.

They remind me of the lady Jesus met at the well in John 4. She was startled Jesus, a Jew, would not only ask her, a Samaritan, for a drink, but she was shocked when he offered her 'Living Water.' This water would quench all thirst and last forever. Jesus exact words were "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I give him will never thirst." Christmas and Rudolph

It was Christmas, 1939, when department store giant Montgomery Ward came up with the "Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer" advertising idea. Robert May came up with Rudolph so Ward's wouldn't have to buy coloring books from a supplier every Christmas. What's more warm-and-fuzzy than a poor rejected deer who turns into the hero? In 1949, songwriter Johnny Marks put the ad-gimmick to

music, and we've sung it every "foggy Christmas Eve" since. Today, Rudolph with his "nose so bright" is as recognized as the One whose birthday we celebrate!

While the story of Rudolph guiding Santa's sleigh is heart-warming, we must be very careful lest it diverts attention from the true meaning of Christmas. Before the birth of Jesus, Zacharias prophesied: "*The rising sun (Jesus) will come to us from heaven...to guide our feet into the path of peace*" (Luke 1:79 NIV) The world is desperate for lasting peace - but not even Rudolph can bring that in Santa's sleigh. Only when we receive the love of God, through Jesus his Son, will there be genuine peace. Peace begins in your Christ-centered heart. I think I would rather follow the star of Bethlehem instead of Rudolph's nose so bright, wouldn't you?


