# Local Resources for Compost and Grass Seed as January 2024

# **COMPOST**

- A few of the suppliers below were trained by the "Maine Composting School."
- Some municipalities offer (free or low cost) compost, but they do not always achieve the proper heating level when making compost.
- For flower & vegetable gardens, avoid compost that uses grass clippings unless you know that the grass was not treated with pesticide.
- Look for compost that is "approved" for Organic land and gardens, which means it meets the NOP (National Organic Program of the USDA) standards for organic gardening. MOFGA Certification is the same as NOP and MOFGA is good for 3 yrs.

### **SOME SUPPLIERS:**

<u>COUNTRY FARE</u> in <u>Bowdoin</u>: bulk. Meets NOP standards (MOFGA 2018) \$46-67/y prices vary. 666-5603.

RAINBOW VALLEY FARMS in <u>Sidney</u>: bulk. An organic dairy farm (Jeff Bragg). Meets NOP standards. \$70-80/y plus <\$100 for the delivery. PFAS test was negative. (this compost is used by Jeff Quirion, landscaper for Kennebec Savings Bank properties)

<u>KINNEY COMPOST</u> in <u>Unity</u>. bulk. Meets NOP standards and does the most frequent chemical analysis and PFAS test is negative. \$70/y, call re: delivery. 568-3683. (Johnny's Selected Seeds has used this compost)

<u>BENSON FARM</u> in Gorham but available at <u>Richmond Farm & Home Supply</u> 737-4502. Bulk, pick up or arrange delivery. "Surf n Turf" Compost is NOP approved.

MB BARK: Bulk. Buy it at Winthrop at D.R. Struck. (It's from Auburn). Meets NOP standards. The "Certified Organic Compost" is made from local grocery store vegetable waste, coffee roaster waste, leaves, some bark. Price varies by amount. 25 y is \$70/y delivered. 786-0600.

<u>COSMIC STONE & GARDEN SUPPLY</u> in <u>Topsham</u>. Meets NOP standards. Several types. See price list \$78/y + delivery

FEDCO SEEDS in Clinton: compost in bags only, 3 excellent types, meets NOP standards

<u>CAMPBELL'S HARDWARE</u>, in <u>Farmingdale</u>; sells bags of "Coast of Maine" compost, which meets NOP standards and is excellent. They use a national company for bulk compost, "Old Castle Lawn & Garden", which DOES NOT MEET NOP standards.

# **GRASS SEED**

- Make sure to use grass seed that is not treated with any coating or chemical. The label should also state "no noxious weeds" and the package should contain <1% of other types of weeds, in general.
- Before buying seed, a good question to ask yourself is "What do you use your lawn for?"
- Diversity is the key! Use a mix including at least 2-3 of the basic grass types:
  - Kentucky Bluegrass: tolerates cold weather, poor shade & drought tolerance
  - o Fine Fescue: tolerates dry soils, acidic or poor-quality soil, poor wear tolerance
  - Perennial Ryegrass: tolerates heavy foot traffic, germinates quickly, not as cold- hardy but OK to use in Maine
  - Tall Fescue: good shade tolerance, good wear tolerance
- And add 5-10% "Mini" or Dutch White Clover to the grass seed. It tolerates drought, crowds out weeds, and feeds nitrogen to the grass.
