

The mission of Abbot Public Library Foundation (APLF) would not be achievable without the generous support of exceptional individuals and groups.

The **Benjamin Abbot Society** is named for Benjamin Abbot, born in Marblehead on Sept. 7, 1795. Learning from his humble beginnings as an apprentice to a Cooper, he later opened his own Cooper Shop and amassed a fortune. He bequeathed \$103,000 to the Town of Marblehead, a portion of which funded the construction of Abbot Hall. For those who give \$75,000 and above.

The James Gregory Society is named for James John Howard Gregory (1827-1910) who was born and educated in Marblehead. Mr. Gregory taught school for several years and then entered the seed trade with a business that started in his home and grew to become one of the largest in the world. This skyrocketing career earned him the title, "The Seed King." Included among his many donations to the Town he most notably gave the clock and bell for Abbot Hall, and funds for the new library.
