Heidelberg Catechism, Lord's Day 1 1 Q. What is your only comfort in life and in death?

A. That I am not my own, but belong—body and soul, in life and in death—to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ. He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood, and has delivered me from the tyranny of the devil. He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven; in fact, all things must work together for my salvation. Because I

belong to him, Christ, by his Holy Spirit, also assures me of eternal life and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.

God's Will for Our Lives

Galatians 5-6 (excerpts)

For you were called to freedom, brothers and sisters. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh,

But through love serve one another.

For the whole law is fulfilled in one word:

"You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

I say, walk in the Spirit, and you will not gratify the desires of the flesh.

The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.

Against such there is no law.
