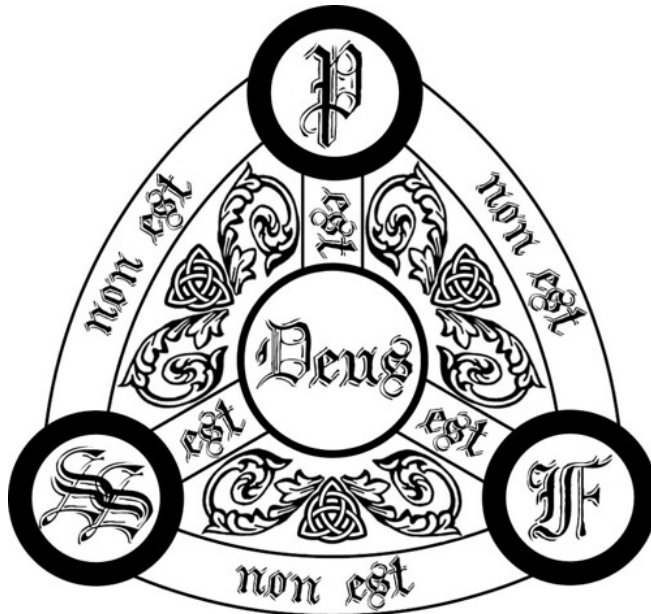

†Confession of Faith The Nicene Creed
