## 2026 MARTIN LUTHER KING MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Due date Wednesday, April 15, 2026, 11:59 p.m.

## I. GUIDELINES

- 1. Recipients must be members of a church financially participating in the Community-Wide Martin Luther King Scholarship fund.
- 2. Applicants must have at least a "C" or 2.0-point average on a 4.0 scale.
- 3. Consideration and assistance will be given to students pursuing a college education at a two year or a four-year institution.
- 4. The application must be submitted online. The letters of recommendation should be scanned, attached, and emailed to <a href="mailto:info@midsouthchurches.com">info@midsouthchurches.com</a> with "MLK Scholarship 2026" listed in the subject line.
- 5. The applying applicant should complete and submit the following by the due date and time listed above.
  - a. A completed MLK Scholarship Application form (submitted online).
  - b. A letter attesting to the good character of the applicant. This letter must be signed by the Pastor, Spiritual Leader, or the Church Secretary.
  - c. A letter of recommendation from your High School Principal or a Teacher. This letter should address the applicant's academic preparation and social deportment necessary for a successful college career.
  - d. A 200–500-word essay explaining why the applicant believes he/she is deserving of and could benefit from this scholarship. The essay must use proper grammar and paragraph structure including introductory and concluding paragraphs.
  - e. Transcript and ACT Scores (Note: If the transcript will not be released until graduation, include the most recent progress report by the scholarship application due date. The transcript must be submitted after it becomes available.)
- 6. Applicants who do not submit a 200–500-word composition will not be awarded the scholarship.

## II. AWARDING PROCESS

- 1. Scholarships will.be awarded each year. The amount shall be no less than \$500.00 and no more than \$1000. 00 per award. The number and amount of awards shall further be determined by the Steering Committee based on the availability of funds and number of applicants.
- 2. The Steering Committee will select persons to review all applications and select the recipient or each award. The decision of the Judges will be final.
- 3. If the recipient does not enroll in school the first semester following high school graduation, the MLK Scholarship will be forfeited.
- 4. The scholarship check or money order shall be made out to the college or university as well as the recipient once the recipient has completed the following: Completed the first semester with a minimum grade point average of a 2.0 or C average.
