

Support Person in the Operating Room (OR)

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- **I. Purpose.** The purpose of this [Support Person in the Operating Room (OR)] policy (this "Policy") is to define a process for providing comfort to a patient in the OR from a person who may not be a hospital employee.
- **II. Scope.** This policy applies to minors, surgical patients with special needs, and patients undergoing Cesarean Sections.
- **III. Policy**. It is the policy of Women & Infants Hospital that a support person be allowed into the operating room with a patient.
- **IV. Definitions.** Terms not already defined in this Policy have the following meanings:
 - (a) Support Person An individual personally known to a patient who provides non-medical, physical, emotional, and informational support to the patient. The Support Person fosters a peaceful environment by assisting the patient to understand procedures, provides comfort through distraction during painful moments, positive reinforcement, encouragement, and reassurance, and may act as an advocate.
 - (b) Minor Persons less than eighteen years of age (See policy: Informed Consent)
 - (c) Persons with special needs Persons with clinical and/or functional developmental disabilities who require assistance for their disabilities which may be medical, mental or psychological.

V. Procedure.

- (a) For surgical patients who are minors or have special needs and will have a support person accompany them to the OR:
 - (1) The first member of the Surgical Services team that recognizes that a patient would benefit from having a support person in the Operating Room (OR) will notify the Director of Surgical Services or designee and the Anesthesia Department.
 - (2) The request to accommodate a support person in the OR will be evaluated by the team (Anesthesia, Nursing and Surgeon).
 - (3) Upon approval by the team (Anesthesia, Nursing, and Surgeon):
 - i. One support person is designated to be present in the Operating Room suite.

- ii. Surgical attire (disposable scrubs/coverall, hat and mask) is donned by the support person before entering the OR.
- iii. Patient and support person are escorted into the operating suite by OR personnel.
- iv. Support person is directed to stay at patient's side during the start of anesthesia induction.
- v. After induction of anesthesia, the Support person is escorted out of the operating suite by an OR staff member.
- (b) For patients undergoing C-Section:
 - (1) C-Section patients are allowed to have a support person present during periods of the procedure deemed appropriate by the surgical team (Anesthesia, Nursing, and Surgeon).
 - i. Requests for more than one support person are considered on a case by case basis based on:
 - a. The ability of the additional support person to provide a higher level of comfort and support to the patient
 - b. The number of personnel present for the procedure and the ability to manage the environment safely.
 - c. A doula is considered part of the care team and is not the same as a support person. A doula is permitted to provide care in the OR, except in an emergency. The doula may enter the Operating Room after spinal is placed and patient is prepped and draped.
 - (2) Surgical attire (disposable scrubs, hat, shoe covers, and surgical mask) is donned by the support person before entering the OR.
 - (3) After the patient is positioned, skin preparation is applied, and the patient is draped, the support person may be escorted into the operating room.
 - (4) The Support person is directed to stay at patient's side during the procedure unless otherwise instructed by OR personnel. Support person must remain seated for safety.
 - (5) The Support person may be allowed to remain with the patient for the duration of the procedure unless the circumstances of the procedure deem otherwise as exampled by:
 - i. The patient's procedure becomes an emergency situation
 - ii. The support person cannot tolerate the OR environment
 - iii. The patient undergoes general anesthesia
 - (6) The Support person is escorted out of the operating room by OR personnel when appropriate.
- (c) In the event of a local, state, or national disaster such as a pandemic, the conditions for allowing support persons in the OR are subject to change.
