The story of Women Speak Up (WSU) is rooted in love, resilience and vision. Our founder, my husband Richard Clost, was born with health challenges. He was raised by a remarkable woman—his mother: Marjolaine Provost-Clost. He experienced first hand what it was like, not just for him but for his mother to cope with the demands of raising a child that needed significant medical care to survive. Through the lows and highs of raising him while his father was away in the army (deployed during the Korean War); and despite the many doctor's visits and surgeries, her strength, sacrifice, and unwavering devotion became his lifelong inspiration.

I joined Richard in this purpose, bringing my own experiences of resilience and a desire to share my own story of learning the value of my voice and the importance of being assertive. We knew that together we could create a space where women's voices are valued and celebrated. What began as a dream has now been a reality for the last six years; we're growing steadily and leaving a tangible footprint in our community. In Ottawa alone, WSU has touched the lives of women through powerful personal stories, mentorship, workshops, social events, and opportunities for connection and healing. 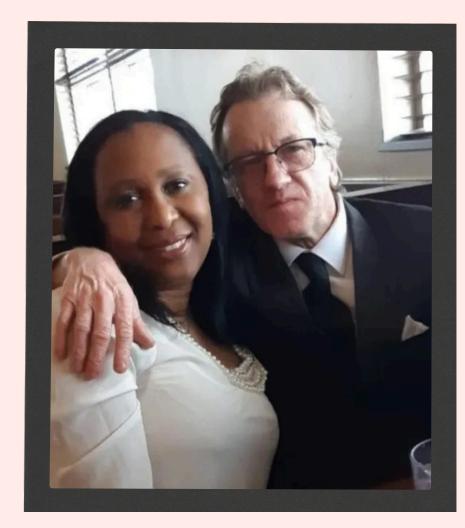

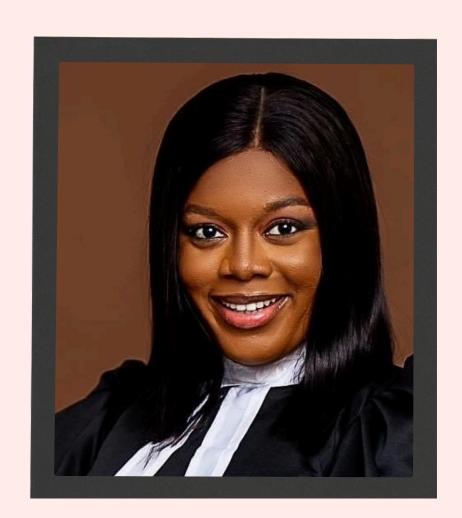

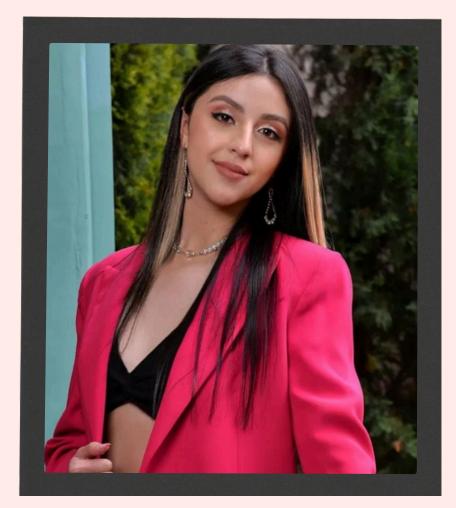

Enhance board capacity, governance structures, and succession planning to build strong and sustainable leadership for the organization.

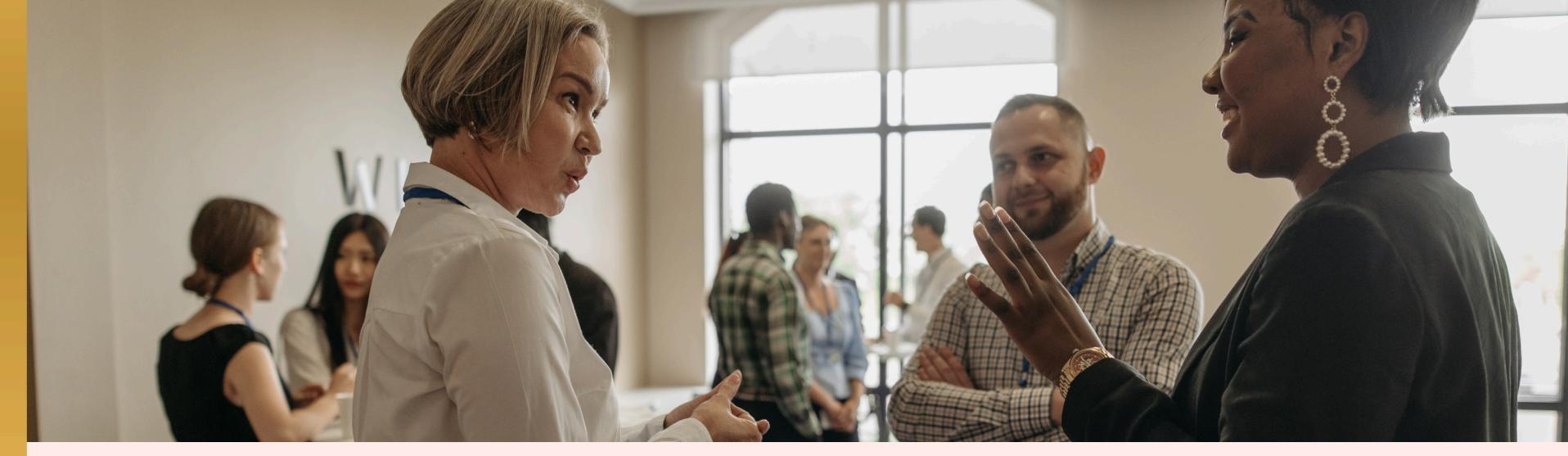
#### **Action Items:**
