
Ohio Department of Health (ODH) Workforce Development Licensure Fund

Qualified individuals who completed the lead abatement contractor, lead abatement worker or lead risk assessor initial training may be eligible for funds to pay for the license fee. Funding is limited and available on a firstcome, first serve basis until May 1 2022 or until funds are spent. Interested individuals should carefully read all instructions and complete the following steps:

Step 1

Submit a complete application to the Ohio Department of Health, Attn: Chris Mizek, 246 North High Street, Columbus, Ohio 43215. DO NOT submit applications online or to the address listed on the top of the application form. Doing so will delay processing of your application and may disqualify you for funding. Funds are only available to cover the cost of initial applications, **renewal applications are not eligible for funding.** Fees paid to the Licensure Program will not reimbursed for this program.

A complete application should include the following:



Lead Risk Assessor - You must meet or exceed one of the following qualifications:

- Be certified, licensed or registered by the State of Ohio as an engineer or architect.
- Have a Bachelor's degree and 1 year experience in lead, asbestos, other environmental remediation or construction.
- Have an Associate's degree and 2 years' experience in lead, asbestos, other environmental remediation or construction.
- Have a high school diploma or GED and 3 years' experience in lead, asbestos, other environmental remediation or construction.

Lead Abatement Contractor- 1-year experience as a Lead Abatement Worker or 2 years' experience in lead, asbestos, or other environmental remediation or construction

Lead Abatement Worker-There are no experience requirements

Lead Inspector- There are no experience requirements

Lead Clearance Technician-There are no experience requirements

Step 2

Once approved for licensure you must take and pass the state examination. Instructions for scheduling the exam will be sent to you in the mail.

The license is usually issued 1-2 weeks after successfully passing the state test.
