## ORDINANCE NO. 1

## SUPERIOR TOWNSHIP

## CHIPPEWA COUNTY, MICHIGAN

An Ordinance to Regulate the Prevention of Sewage Pollution of Superior Township Wells.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to erect, construct, or establish within one hundred and fifty (150) feet of any Superior Township well, and particularly the Superior Township Well, located on the following property:

Part of the Northwest quarter of Southwest quarter (NW 1/4 of SW 1/4) of Section Four (4), Town Forty-six (46) North, Range Two (2) West.

Commencing at the 1/4 post common to Sections Four (4) and Five (5) Town Forty-six (46) North, Range Two (2) West. Thence East 33.0 feet; Thence South 539.0 feet; Thence South 26 degrees 30' East 109.0 feet along proposed street, from which point this description begins to measure; Thence North 64 degrees East, 333.0 feet to the bank of Waiska River; Thence South 20 degrees 45' East 50.0 feet; Thence South 62 degrees West, 325.0 feet, to the East line of a proposed street; Thence North 26 degrees 30' West, 65.0 feet to the point of beginning.

Any source of sewage pollution, such as sewers, privies, cesspools, septic tanks, leeching beds, barnyards, county drains, and similar structures which carry or hold sewage or in which sewage may back up.

- Section 2. Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance may be sentenced to pay a fine of not to exceed \$100.00 or to imprisonment in the county jail for nenty (90) days, or both.
- <u>Section 3</u>. Each day of violation of the provision of this ordinance shall be considered to be a separate and distinct violation.
- Section 4. This ordinance shall be published in The Evening News of Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan, within ten (10) days of passage of this ordinance.
- <u>Section 5</u>. This ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after the publication of the same in the said The Evening News.
- <u>Section 6</u>. If any part or parts of this ordinance are for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Superior Township Board hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each part or parts thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one part or parts be declared invalid or unconstitutional.
