



"I was passionate about these trucks since I was 15. I have always loved things "out of the box" and since they were the fastest production vehicle for 1978- red, and super "different" I was hooked. I continued my life always loving them, but was never able to afford it until one day in 2005, when I found it on Ebay. I bid on it and was the highest bidder for awhile, but then someone else bid on it.... at the last minute I put in a higher bid and won the truck! I and some of my children traveled down to Minnesota to pick it up. (Later on I added a 1979 Lil Red with a 98' Viper driveline in it to my collection). My truck is 1 of only 2188. It has 3279 miles on it and is fully original with original tires, wood, and paint (even down to the factory runs in the paint), (Paint quality was fairly poor in the 70s) To this day the only things changed are the muffler, battery and flu-ids. Only 1 owner before I bought it. Original owner lived in Indiana. I tried to get into contact with Him several times and haven't been able to reach him. It is one of the only survivor class Lil Red, and has won multiple awards. This vehicle has won the Survivor Class award 6 times (every time it's been entered), at the Lil Red Express and Warlock Show in Newport News, Virginia. (In the Survivor class It received 409 points out of 400, (extra points for totally original tires.) At the MCACN Show in Chicago Illinois, it received 2664.09 points out of a possibly score of 2708.67, and received the title of Legend, on the 24th of November 2014. Cars / Trucks are changing, now people care more about aero-dynamics and eco-friendliness than the past. I feel that the timelessness of these vehicles is something we should cherish and enjoy to drive while we still can.
