

HOUSE PLANTS - Class 21

Sections 36 to 59

Must be potted at least three months before the Fair and grown by exhibitor

- 36. Begonia, fancy foliage
- 37. Cactus/succulent mix garden, minimum of 3 plants in one container
- 38. Cactus (Cacti have small, round, cushion-like structures called areoles from which spines, branches, hairs, leaves and even flowers grow. While many succulents may look like cacti, if they do not have these circular areoles, they are not in the cactus family)
- 39. Coleus - disbudded
- 40. Fern – all ferns have spores (small dots) under the fronds. If it flowers or has fruit, it is not a fern
- 41. Geranium/Pelargonium, potted, in bloom
- 42. Geranium(s)/Pelargonium(s) in hanging container, in bloom, 1 cultivar
- 43. Herbs – minimum 3 different cultivars, potted in 1 container, named
- 44. Hibiscus, tropical
- 45. Hoya
- 46. Indoor hanging plant(s) not grown for bloom, 1 cultivar
- 47. Indoor plants growing in a single container, minimum of 3 cultivars.
- 48. Ivy (Hedera)
- 49. Jade plant
- 50. Orchid, blooming
- 51. Outdoor hanging plant(s) in bloom, 1 container, 1 cultivar, named

- 52. Patio Pot, 1 or more cultivars
- 53. Sansevieria (example - Mother in Law's Tongue)
- 54. Spider Plant(s), more than one plant may be in the container as long as they are the same cultivar
- 55. Succulents, 1 cultivar, cactus not to be included (see definition of cactus in item # 41)
- 56. Unlisted house plant(s) in bloom, 1 cultivar, named
- 57. Unlisted house plant(s) not grown for bloom, 1 cultivar, named
- 58. Violet, African, in bloom, single crown
- 59. ZZ plant

CUT FLOWER SPECIMENS

Class 22

Sections 60 to 101

Must be grown by exhibitor. Only attached foliage is permitted unless stated otherwise.

- 60. Asters, 1 colour, 3 stems
- 61. Asters, mixed colours, 3 stems
- 62. Calendulas, 3 stems
- 63. Calla, 1 stem
- 64. Canna, 1 flowering stem must have at least one true leaf attached
- 65. Chrysanthemum, 1 spray, stem or branch
- 66. Coleus, 1 stem, disbudded
- 67. Coneflower/Echinacea, 3 stems from same cultivar
- 68. Cosmos, 1 stem

69. Cut flowers, not listed, 1 stem of each of 3 cultivars, shown in separate containers, named
70. Dahlia, 1 under 15cm (6")
71. Dahlia, 1 over 15cm (6")
72. Dahlia, 3 blooms, different cultivars
73. Geranium/Pelargonium, stem in bloom with attached foliage
74. Gladiolus, 1 spike, any size
75. Grasses, ornamental, 3 stems height maximum 122 cm (48")
76. Hosta, 1 flowering stem, including one leaf from same cultivar
77. Hosta, 1 flowering stem, no foliage
78. Hosta, foliage only, 3 leaves same variety
79. Hydrangea, 1 blooming stem, sepals or bract will be considered a bloom
80. Marigolds single, under 2.5 cm (1"), same cultivar, 3 stems
81. Marigold double, 2.5 – 7.6 cm (1-3"), same cultivar, 3 stems
82. Marigold double, over 7.6 cm (3"), same cultivar, 3 stems
83. Nasturtiums, 3 blooms, may add own foliage
84. Pansies or Violas, with foliage, 3 stems
85. Petunias, single, 3 stems
86. Petunias, double, 3 stems
87. Phlox, perennial, 3 stems
88. Rose, Hybrid Tea, 1 bloom
89. Rose, fragrant, 1 bloom
90. Rose, any other not listed, named, 1 bloom or spray
91. Rose, floating in a suitable container - no foliage, 1 bloom
92. Rudbeckia, 3 stems from one cultivar
93. Salvia, red, 3 stems
94. Salvia, blue, 3 stems
95. Sedum, 1 blooming stem with foliage
96. Snapdragons, tall, 3 spikes
97. Sunflower, multi-flowered on 1 stem, any colour
98. Unlisted cut flower, 1 stem, branch or spray, named
99. Zinnias, over 10 cm (4"), 3 stems
100. Zinnias, from 5 to 10cm (2 to 4"), 3 stems
101. Zinnias, under 5 cm (2") 3 stems
