

#### TRUSTEE REPORT

Hey MAFAA Members, Winterizing Your Antique Fire Truck: A Must for the Colder Months As the weather turns colder and the parade season winds down, it's time to focus on winterizing those cherished antique fire trucks. Proper winterization ensures that your apparatus stays in top condition

through the winter and is ready to shine again next spring. However, if your rig has one last job, chauffeuring Santa through the neighborhood, some of these tasks might need to wait until after the big guy returns to the North Pole!

WINTERIZATION CHECKLIST:
$\square$ Fluids: Check and top off antifreeze, oil, brake fluid, and transmission fluid.
$\square$ Battery: Clean the terminals, and either disconnect the battery or use a trickle charger.
$\square$ Fuel: Add fuel stabilizer and drain the water pump if necessary.
$\square$ Tires: Inflate to the recommended pressure or use jack stands.
$\square$ Cleaning & Covering: Wash the truck and cover it to protect it from dust and moisture.

Santa Claus Duty Calls! For many antique fire trucks, there's often one last mission before winter hibernation—parading Santa through the streets to spread holiday cheer. If your truck is on the nice list, you may need to delay some of the more intensive winterizing tasks, such as draining the pumps or lifting the tires, until after the festive duties are done. After all, a flat tire is the last thing you want when Santa needs to wave from atop your rig!

Just remember—once the holiday lights are unplugged and the cocoa cups are empty, don't forget to winterize your apparatus. A little effort now will save you time and repairs come spring. Ready for Spring 2025!

By properly preparing your antique fire truck for winter, you'll ensure it's ready to roll into next year's parades, musters, and events without a hitch. Who knows, maybe Santa will even put a new chrome bell or shiny hubcap on your Christmas wish list! Keep those rigs ready and rolling!

Here are some rules that will make radio conversations better and more effective:

- 1. The golden rules to follow are CLARITY, BREVITY, SIMPLICITY and SECURITY.
- 2. Remember, that you can either listen or you can talk... not both.
- 3. Identify yourself at the beginning of each transmission by giving your call sign.
- 4. Listen before transmitting. Don't cross talk.
- When multiple people are in range, do not answer a transmission unless you know the call is for you. Listen for your call sign.
- 6. Spell out key words and phrases using the NATO Phonetic Alphabet.
- 7. Do not say YES or NO. Always use the words "AFFIRMATIVE" or "NEGATIVE".
- 8. Know what you are going to say before you press the PTT button.
- 9. Wait for at least a second after pressing the PTT button and before beginning your message.
- 10. Keep the microphone at right angles to your face. Don't talk directly into it.
- 11. Speak slowly, distinctly, clearly
- 12. Do not let your voice trail off at the end of words or sentences.
- 13. Only acknowledge a message when you fully understand it. Or ask to repeat message with "SAY AGAIN" and not REPEAT.
- 14. When you have received and understood the message, respond with "10-4", ok on the message, etc.
- 15. Always acknowledge. Silence is not the completion of a conversation.
- 16. Talk slowly, do not shout and use a professional tone... emotions are a bad idea.
- 17. Keep messages shorter than 20 seconds.
- 18. Use plain English. (No ten codes)

On two-way radios, the common protocol to spell out critical words is to use NATO's phonetic alphabet.

The Massachusetts Antique Fire Apparatus Association (MAFAA) was founded as a local group in early 1977, as a chapter of SPAAMFAA. The purpose of the organization is to promote and preserve antique motorized fire apparatus. However, ownership of apparatus is not required, just a passion for them! A general membership meeting is normally held the first Sunday of each month throughout Eastern Massachusetts. The annual fire apparatus parade, show, and firematic flea market is held in June. A bi-monthly newsletter is published, "Box Alarm" which contains numerous articles, reports, photos and classifieds, and calendar of upcoming events.

Membership in SPAAMFAA is not required, but highly encouraged.
