Running a business is hard and while some of you may dispute this, there are often days where we look at ourselves in the mirror and ask, why did I bother starting this up or is there anyone out there that can help me or even understand what I'm going through?

Well there are people who can help you, and better still, they understand what you're going through. The reason for that is that they, like you, have been also been running a business for a number of years.

If you're fortunate enough to have worked with a mentor, you will appreciate the guidance, expertise and confidence that this person has instilled in you when you were faced with making a difficult decision.

Interestingly, the concept of peer to peer groups is not some new fad. Benjamin Franklin, whose face adorns the \$100 bill in the US, bought a group of 12 people together in 1727 in what he labelled The Junto to focus on mutual improvement by discussing key topics and reaching solutions.

Following that, we had Napoleon Hill coin the term "Mastermind" some 200 years later in his book, Think and Grow Rich where he outlined the premise for a Master Mind Alliance.

"The coordination of knowledge and effort between two or more people who work towards a definite purpose in a spirit of harmony...no two minds ever come together without thereby creating a third, invisible intangible force, which may be likened to a third mind", also known as, the Mastermind

– Napoleon Hill in Think and Grow Rich

Regardless of the history, it's still not a particularly common avenue that business leaders turn to when they realise that they cannot do everything themselves and are wondering who to turn to for help.

Other things that should be considered is the concept of **Value**. You need to feel that the group that you are participating in is giving you value in relation to the investment that you are making in terms of your time in attending, the actual monetary investment and the solutions that you are receiving.

Groups can take any number of formats, and the one that I am most familiar with is as follows where the session is broken up into three key components:

- a number of **masterminds** where a member presents an issue, challenge or opportunity that they need help with
- **workshops** covering a range of 50 different business related topics & accompanying workbooks
- **accountability** review sessions – where a member details what they have accomplished from the last meeting having participated in the mastermind session on that occasion

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So, now over to you.
