



KARL INFANGER HHS/BMHS ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME CLASS OF 2024



Karl Infanger, an outstanding athlete from the Class of 1993, earned nine varsity letters at BMHS in golf, hockey, and volleyball.

He was the captain of Coach Mike Cowdery's golf team and earned the 1991 Most Improved Player Award, the 1992 Coaches Award and 1992 MVC All-Star.

In hockey, Karl was part of four MVC title-winning teams, two of which earned berths in the elite MIAA Super 8 Tournaments. Karl was known for his defense on Coach Jim Wronski and Coach Mark Jenkin's squads. He was honored as a 1993 MVC All-Star defenseman, 1993 MVC All-Conference defenseman and Boston Globe All-Scholastic First Team selection and received his teams Coaches Award.

In the spring, Karl excelled on the volleyball court for Coach Karen McNulty, leading the team to 1992 and 1993 Division I MIAA state tournament berths. He was chosen the 1992 and 1993 Lowell Sun Player of the Year. The Boston Globe recognized his





outstanding seasons as well, honoring him as a 1992 All-Scholastic Second Team Hitter and 1993 an All-Scholastic First Team Hitter. His team recognized him as its 1993 MVP, and the league chose him as a 1993 North Alliance All-Conference Player.

Karl continued his education at Merrimack College, playing in the prestigious Hockey East Conference. He was twice chosen as a Hockey East All-American and was awarded Merrimack's Coaches Award and Unsung Hero Award. After graduating college, Karl went on to play professional hockey in the East Coast League and International Hockey League, where he achieved all-star status.

When his playing days were over, Karl settled down in Medway, Mass., with his wife Julie and two children, Alex and Emilie. He is now a wellness and physical education teacher at Medway High School. Although he hung up his "playing skates," he turned to coaching the Medway-Ashland co-op girls hockey team where he was proud to coach his daughter and cheer on his son playing for the Medway High boys team.
