## DAIRY

Milk produced in Texas in 2017 had an estimated value of almost \$2 billion, which is 7.4 percent of the total value of all Texas agriculture commodity projection.

Texas' dairy farmers produce more than 12 billion pounds of milk (about 1.4 billion gallons) annually.

Texas is the 5th largest milk producing state.

The average Texas dairy farm's herd has 1,077 cows (eighth nationally).
