DESCRIPTION

Outdoor Educators at Youth and Young Adult Outdoor Education (YAYA) work with diverse high school students from across Northern California, gaining hands-on experience in adapting lessons to meet varied learning needs. Our program focuses on personal identity development through journaling, reflection, and immersive lessons in local ecology and biodiversity. As an educator, you'll collaborate with YAYA staff, teachers, and chaperones to foster an inclusive environment where all participants feel supported. This role enhances your skills in differentiated instruction while deepening students' connection to the natural world. Educators also assist with the annual fundraiser, directly supporting the program's sustainability.

We are dedicated to fostering personal growth and reflection through meaningful outdoor experiences. Recognizing a gap in nature-based programs tailored for high school students, we designed our curriculum to encourage deeper connections with both nature and self. JOB REQUIREMENTS

Work and Education

- At least 2 year of experience in outdoor education or high school age groups
- Higher Certification is always a bonus (WFR, WFA, EMT)

- Must have transportation and possess a valid driver's license and clean driving record
- Participate in moderate physical activity, including but not limited to hiking, navigating over rocky terrain, working in various weather conditions and lifting up to 40lbs
- Maintain positivity and make decisions in adverse conditions such as changes in schedules or staffing, unexpected changes, long working hours or crisis

RESPONSIBILITIES

Program

- Facilitate daily activities such as opening/closing ceremonies, solo hikes, and journaling reflections based on provided prompts.
- Lead weekly "Camper's Choice" sessions to promote skill-building among participants.
- Develop and deliver lessons aligned with YAYA's curriculum and core values.
- Stay on-site during program weeks, including one on-call overnight shift every other week.
- Lead outdoor explorations, including hiking, tide pool studies, agriculture, gardening, and creek exploration.

- Organize and lead evening activities like campfire discussions, night hikes, games, and songs.
- Ensure student safety and supervision by implementing established policies and procedures.
- Create a positive learning environment, centering on student needs and engagement.
- Teach garden-based lessons focusing on agriculture, pesticide/fertilizer use, and energy conservation in farm-to-table practices.
- Guide students in meal preparation from scratch to be shared with the entire camp.
- Incorporate diverse teaching methods such as hands-on activities, games, journaling, and environmental arts to support student understanding.
- Additional duties and tasks to ensure the safety and success of the program

Fundraiser

- Support the achievement of the organization's fundraising goals.
- Supervise and assist volunteers during event activities.
- Collaborate with the team to ensure a high-quality event experience.
- Share YAYA's mission and vision with attendees.
- Oversee designated aspects of the fundraising benefit.
