# 5th Sunday of Lent

#### **Dual Reflections**

Please Note: Because of the scrutinies, at the 10:30 mass, we will be using the Readings from Cycle A. They will be used for the three Sundays before Holy Week.

#### 4:00 Mass:

This jubilee year reminds us that we are pilgrims of hope. Our lives are a pilgrimage and the season of Lent is a concentration of that journey. This time of penitence, of sacrifice, and of suffering is our pilgrimage to the cross, the scene and sign of Jesus' greatest sacrifice. But our faith tells us that neither the cross nor death is the end. Therefore, we can be pilgrims of hope, confident that our journeys through Lent and through life will not end in death, but in new life. May our hope for salvation encourage us as we approach the holiest week of the year.

#### 10:30 Mass:

On this final Scrutiny Sunday we hear one of the most dramatic stories in any of the Gospels: the raising of Lazarus. Four days after he was buried, Jesus calls Lazarus forth from the tomb. When Lazarus emerges, Jesus orders the onlookers to untie his burial cloths, which had bound him in death. Today we are invited to consider what sins are binding us to death so that we can free ourselves and others from them and find new life in Christ, for he is truly the resurrection and the life.

#### The Jubilee Prayer

Father in heaven, may the faith you have given us in your son, Jesus Christ, our brother, and the flame of charity enkindled in our hearts by the Holy Spirit, reawaken in us the blessed hope for the coming of your Kingdom. May your grace transform us in to tireless cultivators of the seeds of the Gospel. May those seeds transform from within both humanity and the whole cosmos in the sure expectation of a new heaven and a new earth, when, with the powers of Evil vanquished, your glory will shine eternally. May the grace of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, a yearning for the treasures of heaven. May that same grace spread the joy and peace of our Redeemer throughout the earth. To you our God, eternally blessed, be glory and praise forever. Amen.

Holy Week is approaching. Next Sunday is Palm/ Passion Sunday, the Feast of our Lord's entry into Jerusalem and the recounting of those events leading up to His death upon the Cross. For us as Christians, the intensity of our Catholic Faith increases. The time is at hand to think about the Son of God voluntarily going to the cross. Each person needs to meditate on the meaning of the Cross. Each person needs to try to fathom the degree of sacrifice, the degree of humility, represented in Jesus Christ going to the Cross. The Apostle Paul told the Corinthians: "I determined not to know anything among you except Jesus Christ and Him Crucified."
