REFLECTION

CELEBRATING THE ANNIVERSARY OF YOUR BAPTISM - Tell the story of your child's baptism. Where was it held? Who were the godparents and why they were chosen? Who was the priest that baptized you? Why did they select your baptismal name? Explain the significance of the baptism. Why so young? What role the parents/guardians and godparents played? What did God do when you were baptized? Display items from his/her baptism on your prayer table or home altar. Is the certificate of baptism displayed? The baptismal garment and candle brought out. Light his/her baptismal candle and say a special prayer. Bless your child. Use some holy water to bless the child's forehead with the sign of the cross.
