SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

You must be registered in the Parish for six months. Arrangements for the Baptism must be arranged by the parents. All sponsors should be carefully selected and must be at least 16 years of age. Non-practicing, fallen away Catholics are not eligible for sponsorship, even if they are close relatives or friends. The Sponsors are required to bring a letter of eligibility from their Church.

Couples planning a wedding must contact the rectory six to nine months before the date.

Couples are obligated to follow Parish Policy and are required to attend the Diocese Pre-Cana

Program.

Scripture Reflection

Today's readings can remind us how appropriate it is to give thanks to God, just as we would thank a neighbor who does something special for us. Let us be a thankful people, expressing a spirit of gratitude throughout our lives.

What I would like you to PRAY ABOUT:

Jesus offers us abounding grace and mercy - but what does it mean if we walk away as if we do not recognize that he has offered us this reconciliation with the Father? We have not received the fullness of his mercy until our recognition of Jesus' offer of healing turns us to him and, through him, to God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit.

Now You Know.... From the PLC

October 12, 2025

What do we reflect upon when we pray the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary?

In general, the Luminous Mysteries seek to understand how the fundamental actions and teachings of Jesus in His ministry shed light on Him. The baptism of the Lord (first mystery) sheds light on the identity of Jesus as the Son of God. There is a revelation of the Trinity and Jesus is anointed the Christ. The wedding feast of Cana (second mystery) sheds light on the nuptial relationship of Christ and His bride, the Church, and led many of His disciples to believe in Him. It also shows the boundless love of God. The proclamation of the kingdom (third mystery) shows how the Lord's actions and teachings shed light on a darkened world and summon us to the light of truth. This mystery is a broad and rich source of reflection when we focus on the kingdom of light expelling the kingdom of darkness. It tells us to repent, turn away from the darkness of sin, and be enlightened by the Gospel. The Transfiguration (fourth mystery) sheds light on the true glory of Jesus as God and as the fulfillment of all that the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah) said of Him. It also sheds light on the Trinity with the Father speaking, Jesus there, and the cloud of the Holy Spirit. The Institution of the Eucharist (fifth mystery) sheds light on the Lord's passion and His promise to remain with us in the Eucharist, perpetuating His once-for-all saving sacrifice. Jesus gave us His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity from His First Coming to His Second, so we would never be without Him on our journey to the Father. Now you know!
