You must be registered in the Parish for six months. Arrangements for the Baptism must be arranged by the parents. All sponsors should be carefully selected and must be at least 16 years of age. Non-practicing, fallen away Catholics are not eligible for sponsorship, even if they are close relatives or friends. The Sponsors are required to bring a letter of eligibility from their Church.



SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

Couples planning a wedding must contact the rectory six to nine months before the date.

Couples are obligated to follow Parish Policy and are required to attend the Diocese Pre-Cana

Program.

Scripture Reflection

Many athletes can tell you how important stamina is to their success. In the closing minutes of a game, it can often come down to who still has the energy to do their best. Often our faith requires stamina as well. Beaten down by tragedies and disappointments, is our faith strong enough to enable us to persist in loving God and loving neighbor, to pursue justice and peace, to continue to build the kingdom? May hope, which we celebrate this Jubilee Year, sustain our stamina to the end of our days.

What I would like you to PRAY ABOUT:

We all struggle with a lack of faith. We often fear our prayers aren't heard. We're unsure what the sacraments mean. We can feel we are going through the motions of prayer, even at Mass. Jesus asks in today's gospel, "When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" Perhaps Jesus' question is even more apt for us now - perhaps it was MEANT for us. Let us pray that our hearts will always cherish a belief in the crucified and resurrected Lord, and that our lives will always reflect that faith.

Thoughts from Deacon Bill:

When someone approaches Our Lady of Hope Parish and says they want to become a Catholic it touches my very being. I guess there can be profound theological reasons for this kind of decision, but I believe most become interested because they appreciate "the flavor" of what they see right here in our home parish. Whether here or other parishes I've been assigned to, what I hear most often is, "I want to join because I feel at home here." In the early days of the Civil Rights Movement, Dr. Martin Luther King told his followers to sing when they were marching. He felt visible joy would bring more people to the movement. Apparently, Our Lady of Hope has been "singing" about their faith and now our enthusiasm has brought more people to join with us. If we weren't welcoming, we would have no one new to welcome. The joy we show tells a great story - one of faith, hope, and love. All of these things are Christ-centered, but we recognize the best way to show God our love is by loving one another. May we never forget LOVE is at the heart of all we are called to be. Let us show that love to our Catechumen as he begins his journey to the Easter Sacraments. Remember, we will all be journeying with him by our faith, hope - and most especially by our love.



Now You Know.... From the PLC

Before receiving Holy Communion, we say, "Lord I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." What is the word?

The expression "say the word" is another way of saying "Just give the command" or "All you have to do is will it, Lord, and it will be done." The specific word is not as important as the fact that God wants to heal us. It helps to recall Scripture where we are focused on the words of the centurion who had a servant who was gravely ill. When Jesus offers to go and heal him, the centurion says, "Lord, I am not worthy to have You come under my roof, but only say the word and my servant will be healed." (Matthew 8:8). The centurion then says, "For I am a man under authority, with soldiers subject to me; and I say to one, 'Go.' and he goes; and to another, "Come." and he comes, and to my slave, 'Do this.' and he does it." (Matthew 8:9). So, the centurion is affirming that it is only necessary that Jesus wills the healing to take place, not that He go somewhere or say some specific words. Jesus marvels at the centurion's faith. "And to the centurion Jesus said, 'Go, let it be done for you as you have believed.' And the servant was healed at that very moment." (Matthew 8:13). So the healing was done "according to the word." Now you know!
