Non-practicing, fallen away Catholics are not eligible for sponsorship, even if they are close relatives or friends. The Sponsors are required to bring a letter of eligibility from their Church.

Couples planning a wedding must con-tact the rectory six to nine months before the date Couples are obligated to follow Parish Policy and are required to attend the Diocese Pre-Cana Program.

**DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL** - Your gifts to the Diocesan Annual Appeal enables us to serve the poorest, weakest and the most vulnerable among us through Catholic Social Services. Staff who feed the hungry, clothe the naked and provide shelter, counseling and assistance for those most in need. Many more individuals in parish communities receive assistance through parish based Social Justice Programs funded by the Appeal. Grants were awarded to 33 parish programs including food and clothing pantries, monthly dinners for families in need and outreach to prison inmates. The Diocese allocated us \$3,000 to support our outreach for the hygienic needs of those young people 10-13 yrs. of age. It is a serious problem. To date, Fr. Terry has purchased about \$3,300 worth of items. It comes just in time for the school term. We will conduct an additional drive like this in time for Lent

**CELEBRATING 175 YEARS -** The Sisters of Christian Charity, founded by Pauline von Mallinckrodt, in Paderborn, Germany, are celebrating their 175th Anniversary as a Congregation. It is also the 150th Anniversary of the Sisters arriving at St. Nicholas Parish, Wilkes-Barre on October 15, 1873. Soon after their arrival Father Nagle asked other German Pastors if they wanted Sisters to teach in their parish school. The response was a whole-hearted yes and as a result, the Congregation grew quickly in the United States. The "Cradle" of the Congregation in the United States was established in Wilkes-Barre with the building of Mallinckrodt Convent as the motherhouse in 1877. In addition to a school for girls known as St. Ann's Academy. The motherhouse was transferred to Illinois (1916) and then to New Jersey (1927). St. Ann's Academy remained open until 1971. Wyoming Valley also became home to the Sisters serving in the following parishes: St. Nicholas/St. Nicholas-St. Mary, Bishop Hoban/Holy Redeemer High School, St. Boniface, Wilkes-Barre; Sacred Heart, Luzerne; St. Mary Assumption, Pittston; St. Jude Mountain Top; and Kingston Central Catholic/Bishop O'Reilly High School. Bishop Bambera will celebrate the Eucharistic Liturgy in St. Nicholas Church on November 4, at 12PM. We look forward to seeing you to help celebrate this momentous event. Our parish through a grant from the Annual Appeal, has already purchased over \$3,000 worth of items that poor families may be unable to provide for their children. There are many pro-life issues: (abortion, immigrants, homeless, racism and prejudice, etc.) These are hot items and need to be addressed by our Catholic Christians. "Almighty and ever living God, have mercy on us. Help us to recognize others as our brothers and sisters in Christ and actively work for their good.
