<u>Ash Wednesday</u>- Two Masses are scheduled for this Ash Wednesday. They will be celebrated at 8:00 AM. and 5:30 PM. Blessed ashes will be administered following a brief homily. Ashes will be available for anyone unable to attend. When you bless someone with the ashes, place them on the forehead (with a Q-tip) and say:

"Remember, You are Dust and Unto Dust You Shall Return". Follow it by reciting the Our Father.

Fast and Abstinence - The regulations for the Lenten practices for fast and abstinence are: **Fasting**- On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, those who are 18 but not yet 60 are allowed only one full meal. Two smaller meals are allowed as needed, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.

<u>Abstinence from meat</u>- Those who are 14 years of age or older are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent.

<u>Stations of the Cross</u> - Starting this Friday we will begin this devotion starting at 5:30 pm. Bring the family.

How should we think about Lent this year? How can I explore Lent as an opportunity for a new beginning and not a contest with myself about keeping a resolution (like New Year's resolution)? How to practice believing during Lent that these 40 days are about being loved, loving and not being punished and unloved? How to choose a daily practice or prayers to say daily that would help me let go of an image of God who prefers punishing to loving? I find for myself that Lent brings out all the "old" images of God and spirituality that I think I've let go of in recent years. Childish thoughts arise as I attempt to embrace this season with sincerity and authenticity:

If I give up (fill in the blank for 40 days), then God will reward me. Lent is a time to feel sad and disappointed because I am not perfect.

<u>Recognizing the love of God</u> for me is not the substance of Lent, that's Christmas and Easter.

Lent is hard work, like pulling weeds. As a child of God, I need to be more loving, more courageous, most truthful. This does require sacrifice, openness to others, insights about my shortcomings and gifts and spiritual exercises that makes me more fully the person God wants me to be. Don't get me wrong, I don't mind a season of taking a long look at myself who knows God as loving, wise, patient, all forgiving, and always with us. I need time to find practices, people, readings that help me receive from God the energy I need to live a Christian life. I'm sure coming to a place I wish to be is hard work, living up to my baptismal commitment and to model the love of Jesus in my life. I sometimes long for the good old days. Giving up candy, cigarettes, booze and gambling is much easier than loving others and myself. I wish all of you well as you begin Lent and by the grace of God envelop, embrace and encourage you to be able to mirror God's love. I wish you well in celebrating Lent in whatever way makes sense to you as a child of a loving God.
