

# U.S. Naval Air Station Flyers Far East Champions 1951

In 1951 the naval Air Station Atsugi, Japan had a football team that won the Far East Championship. This team defeated eleven other teams from other service teams stationed in the Far East. Their opponents were teams from the Marine Corp., Navy, Air Force, and the Army.

This team was composed of players whose units were stationed at Atsugi during that time. There were from Com Far Japan, Naval Air Station, V.P.-6, Fasron 120 and MCB#2.

### **SEABEE INGENUITY**

From 1950's PACIFIC STARS AND STRIPES.....

Ingenuity that keeps pace with the exigencies of materials handling is something that members of the Navy's Mobile Construction Battalion Two have demonstrated they have lots of.

MCB-2 was sent to Japan in December, 1950 to rehabilitate and expand a new navel air station. There were times when the several thousand rail carloads of rock and gravel arriving on the station almost "threw" the Seabees, but the men wound up "throwing" the rock and gravel by turning the freight cars right up on their sides.

At first the rail shipments of crushed rock arrived before the battalion's heavy equipment. There were no unloading facilities... so the work was done by hand... unloading the rock into trucks.

Soon a clamshell was put into operation. This increased production by 30 percent.... however the clamshell bucket caused damage to the flimsy wood rail car bodies.

Then as gravel arrived and the clamshell proved incapable of unloading the daily quota of cars. The first Seabee-inspired answer was a bulldozer blade modified so it could be suspended from the crane. Both sides of the railroad cars were removed and the bulldozer blade dragged across the car, spilling the gravel alongside the car to be picked up by carryalls.

The "crane-dozer" was a real improvement. Chief Construction Driver Kermit D. Hagan was responsible, and under his direction the unloading crew emptied as many as 50 rail cars per day.

All went well until MCB#2's 120 ton per hour rock crusher was installed. This required the arrival of 100 rail cars of rock per day. To meet the situation, personnel of MCB#2 drew on their collective accumulation of construction experience.

The idea had jelled in the mind of Chief Construction Mechanic Clark L. Fraser. The possibilities of his "brain storm" was tossed around among builders, drivers, steelworkers and mechanics. "Scrounged" equipment was collected from Yokosuka to Tachikawa.... then the work began on a "Car Dumper".


On a rail spur, a section of track the length of a railroad car was cut away. A slab of concrete 18" thick was poured in the cut-away section. In the slab was embedded a framework of 12" l-beams with protruding "eyes" at the ends of the transverse beams along one side of the track. A similar framework, with rails welded to its top, was hinged to the embedded framework.

To provide stanchions from which a 3-part wire rope tackle could be suspended for lifting the unhinged side of the track section, two I-beams were embedded vertically in concrete. A scrap GMC truck, stripped of everything except front winch and two winches driven by the rear drive shafts, supplies power for tilting the entire track section 35 degrees.

A loaded car is towed into the tilting track section by means of the front winch. The rail car is fastened to the track support frame. The rear winches are engaged after the side of the car has been dropped. The entire car and track section are then tilted so all the rock spills from the car into a sunken hopper. After dumping the car is gently lowered back to level.

A jeep-engine-powered conveyor belt removes the rock from the sunken hopper and stockpiles it convenient to the rock crusher pick-up conveyor.

Unloading a car requires 3 men for 5 minutes. Seabee ingenuity and scrap material have done the job... again. 100 cars can easily be emptied in an 8-hour day.



AND SO THE SEEBEES really had to turn things up on their sides—just like this. Strapped to a hinged section of track, carloads of rock spew their contents over dropped sideboards directly into sunken hopper, then to a conveyor which feeds the rock crusher.
