[10-4] Last year, I was not too interested in the paper as my wife's mother was in and out of the hospital and we were very busy with her. Also, I do not recognize too many of the names of the ones at Cubi Point. I hope I can remember more names after I get the roster. I do remember **Rich Nelson**, a Yeoman; **Bob Long**, also a Yeoman; and **Rex Roark**. I have a picture of **Rex** and will send it when I find it again. **Bob**, **Rich** and I had a lot of fun while there. [the **Rich Nelson** on our roster was a Builder and worked on the concrete pouring crew at Haversack, **Gene**.] I remember when I was at Cubi, I was assigned to operate a motor grader and worked with Pete Peterson while he operated a Cat and pan. We were building roads and ammunition revetment bases about ten miles from the main base. We were in MCB 2 Detachment A. While there, a camera crew took movie pictures for a future training film. Can this be found? I know this happened as I was working one afternoon while the others were drinking beer at our PX. [I find this hard to believe! Seabees drinking beer and left you working?!] If you can find this film, I would like to see it. I know that Pete **Peterson** passed away last year and I felt very proud to have known him. May God rest his soul and bring peace to his family. Please keep up the good work that you are doing and MAY I COME ABOARD, PLEASE? [absolutely!]..... from Clive Lorenz: Enclosed is my dues check [thanks] and some for a roster. I enjoy the Newsletter as it brings back memories. Keep up the good work [thanks, I'll try.] I'm a former Seabee with a fleet rate. [there were a lot of

those, especially during WW II]..... from **George Terry**: I sure enjoy the Newsletter and I see names I still remember from my CB days. Just a note to let you know that I was never a member of MCB 2, per se. I attended boot camp at Great Lakes and went from there to Port Hueneme for a guaranteed class A school by being a high school graduate. The steelworker school had already started and was about 2/3 finished, so I had to wait about 3 or 4 weeks until a new class would start. Certainly you had to do something while you wait, so I was put on mess cooking. After about a week, I'd had enough of working in the scullery. While walking back to the barracks one day, I passed a steelworker from South Carolina and told him that I came to the Seabees to be an iron worker because that's what I had been doing since I was 10 or 12 years old. My father owned and ran a steel fabricating and erection business. Chief **Sheffer** asked me if I could weld. After telling him I could, he took me down to the bay where he had a crew welding splice plates on pontoons instead of putting them together with the "jewelry" or bolts, as was customary. A guy gave me a helmet and the stinger and I ran a vertical weld that my father would have been proud of. **Sheffer** told me my mess cooking days were over. A causeway was to go to St. Nicholas Island just off the coast of California which was a drone (pilotless plane) landing strip. I was then placed in MCB 2 Det. "A." After going to St. Nicholas, we went to Midway Island to extend a runway and I helped to maintain equipment, asphalt pavers, etc. After about 7 or 8 months, we were sent to Camayan Point, then to Subic Bay, Cubi Point. I was still in MCB 2 Det. "ABLE." Then I was transferred to MCB 5 and sent to West Quarry to help maintain rock crushers and other heavy equipment such as Euclid off-road trucks, etc., and shovels, clam buckets, etc. I enlisted in July 1951 and was released in June 1955 to the ready reserves. I got my Honorable Discharge in July 1959 with a total of 8 years service. So, you see, I was never really in MCB 2. [sorry, but you

were in MCB 2... Detachment Able was a part of MCB 2] I have enclosed a check for my dues and would like to have a roster. [thanks, and a roster is on the way.] I was in the PI 39 months on 3 trips..... from **Robert Long**: I noticed I was not on the "Good Guy List" so here are my dues [thanks]. Missed the reunion in Charleston but plan to be in San Antonio. ps: Pardon the stationery [it has flowers all over it]. It belonged to my ex-wife. [that's what you got out of the divorce? Wow! 





ACTION: ALL SHIPS AND STATIONS

- 1. The following activity is established under an officer in charge, effective 1 June 1950:
 - U. S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion No. 2
 - U. S. Naval Construction Battalion Center

Port Hueneme, California

This activity is a mobile unit whose movements will be directed by the Chief of Naval Operations. While temporarily shore based at the U. S. Naval Construction Battalion Center, Port Hueneme, California, it is under the command of the Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet, exercised through such subordinate commander as the Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet, shall order. While afloat or at an overseas base in the Pacific area, it shall be under the command of the Commander in Chief, U. S. Pacific Fleet. While afloat or at an overseas base outside the Pacific area, it shall be under the command of the appropriate fleet or naval commander.

2. The mission of this activity is as follows:

MISSION: To be used for advanced base construction, the development of techniques connected therewith, training of such Reserve Construction Battalion units as may be assigned, and for participation in special task force projects.
