for 18 months in CBD 1503, then to MCB 2 Det. "A" when they came to do the groundwork for the BMEWS Line. Then back to Missouri for leave and to San Francisco for assignment to CHB 2

(Cargo Handling Battalion). Next, Guam running cranes in the port area, loading and unloading cargo on and off ships. I've since learned we were supporting the buildup for the B52 base, nuclear weapons and all. Of course, that information wasn't shared with a bunch of working Seabees. I left Guam in September '54 for discharge, then home. It's been hard to get me out of Missouri except for vacations since then! [hope you can make it down to San Antonio].... received dues from Hank Bentsen, and John Ginther [thanks]..... from Gene McDonagh: Enclosed are my dues [thanks]. Hope to see you in San Antonio...... from Glen Bates: Enclosed find my dues [thanks]. I always look forward to the Newsletter to see if I can find any name out of the past. The only name I have found was John Schneider on Midway. [check the letter from Bill Duensing, above.] John was from Illinois and must be the same John I knew. In 1950 at Port Hueneme I was assigned to the 103rd on Guam and sent with Det. A to Midway to open the base for air evacuation out of Korea. Midway had been completely closed for several years. I remember we got most of our equipment out of what was left there, from the sub base and the dump. About 80% of the men were those called back into service from reserve units. I was 21 and the youngest guy in the outfit. Most were in their 30s or older and some as old as 50+. I'll never forget working with a first class Builder from the Boston area who had been called back. He had an engineering degree from M.I.T. and the officers were always after him to take a commission and all he would say was when he got out of this, "you'll never get me into another reserve unit." As I remember, we had been on Midway almost a year before the change to MCB 2. I was only there for a short time after that. After leave, I was reassigned



back to Guam and MCB 10. I was there about 6 or 8 months and then sent with a detachment to Kwajalein. At that time they were doing a lot there because of the atomic testing going on in

the area. It was an interesting time. Personnel there from several countries and aircraft from the English and French air force. I had the opportunity while there to work on the new home for the Admiral. After discharge from the Navy, I went to college and received a B.S. degree in physics, taught for eight years and then went to work for the electric utility in the area. Covered much of Oregon and a small part of northern California. I retired from the utility in 1989 and have enjoyed every day of my retirement. Joan and I have 2 children (both in their 40s) and 2 grandchildren. We like to travel, mostly in the US and in winter we do quite a bit of snowmobiling. We have a nice cabin in the mountains about 40 miles from home and spend much of the summer there. Hope to meet you one of these days and maybe swap a few sea stories. 


