

The personnel officer came out and asked what was wrong and I told him the man had his family on the way and now he was being sent to Korea. He said no big deal that he would find him a replacement. I raised my hand and said you got him (me). I wanted off Guam so bad that I volunteered for Korea. The Lt. said, "I should have known you had a motive." But he said I could go. The young man's



name was **Sontheimer**. We were on **Jay Withrow**'s (BU1) crew. I have never regretted that move. I notice a lot of the men were at Cubi Point. I was there in '53 & '54 then came east to finish my

career. I was at Gitmo for three tours; then Argentia for two tours; Port Layote, Morocco; Bermuda; and two years in heaven - Trinidad, West Indies, from '63, '64, & '65. I consider my career as one big holiday (with work) that I could never have had otherwise. I know a lot of the fellows feel the same way.
