




helps]. We hope to make the Cleveland reunion and, if so, we will probably drive. Hope to see you there and thanks for all you guys do...... from **Ben**



A Letter From Michael L. Reidel

I received your name from Capt. William C. Hilderbrand of the CEC/Seabee Historical Foundation in Gulfport, Mississippi. My father, Laurence Duane "Bud" Reidel (died May 26, 1973) of Lake Villa, Illinois, was a Driver Third Class with Mobile Construction Battalion 5. His dates of active service were from January 29, 1951, through November 29, 1952. His most significant duty assignment was at Subic Bay in the Philippine Islands.

As my father has been dead over twenty-eight years, he never met his granddaughters, now ages seven and nine, nor was he able to tell them of his Seabee experiences. It is for this reason that I have contacted you. Should you, or any of your friends, have known my father and are willing to share any reminiscences you may have, a short letter would be greatly appreciated. 



We've Always Done It That Way!

The US Standard Railroad Gauge, i.e. the distance between the rails, is 4' 8¹/₂". That's an exceedingly odd number. Why was that gauge used? Because that's the way they built them in England, and English expatriates built the US railroads.

Why did the English build them like that? Because the first rail lines were built by the same people who built the pre-railroad tramways, and that's the gauge they used.

Why did "they" use that gauge then? Because the people who built the tramways used the same jigs and tools that they used for building wagons, which used that wheel spacing.

Okay! Why did the wagons have that particular odd wheel spacing? Well, if they tried to use any other spacing, the wagon wheels would break on some of the old, long distance roads in England, because that's the spacing of the wheel ruts.

And the ruts in the roads? Roman war chariots formed the initial ruts, which everyone else had to match for fear of destroying their wagon wheels. Since the chariots were made for Imperial Rome, they were all alike in the matter of wheel spacing. The US Standard Railroad Gauge of 4' 8¹/₂" is derived from the original specifications for an Imperial Roman war chariot. And bureaucracies live forever. So the next time you are handed a specification and wonder what horse's behind came up with it, you may be exactly right, because the Imperial Roman war chariots were made just wide enough to accommodate the back ends of two war horses.


