

sioned. After nine months, I volunteered for two years duty and served from 1957-1959 with MCB 7. After three years as a civilian, I joined the Reserves and retired in 1994 with thirty years total service as a UTCS. We are looking forward to the reunion!..... from Jack Foster: Sorry my dues ran out. Old age doesn't help the memory. way]. I would like to hear from anybody that was in Advanced Base Construction Division (ABCD)o n the West coast......That's all folks.... See you in Cleveland!





NAS photographers will move into their new laboratory as soon as a few minor discrepancies are corrected. Dark rooms and working spaces are air-conditioned.




Parachute riggers are now housed in their new building located across the road from the supply department.






