

Just for information, I am the curator for the Naval Facilities Historical Program, so I am responsible for both the Port Hueneme and Gulfport exhibits, hence my title is Curator, CEC/Seabee Museum. Our Director, Ms. Lara Tobias, oversees both facilities.

The Gulfport facility is not a 'stand alone' but is considered an annex to the main museum in Port Hueneme. Anything donated to either facility goes into one catalog and is usually stored at Port Hueneme if it is not on display. Identical photo essays will be located in both museums no matter what. The more artifacts we are able to locate, then the better the exhibit will be in our annex facility since the goal is to have mirror exhibits. As you can see, it is critical to recover as much Korean era history as we can in order to tell the story in the best way possible!

## The CEC/Seabee Museum Needs Your Help!

Kim A. Crowell, Curator of the CEC/Seabee Museum, Naval Facilities Historical Program, is asking Seabees that served in Korea during the Korean War help her locate artifacts and historical information about the Seabees that served in-country during the Korean War (25 June 1950 to 27 July 1953) in preparation for exhibits in the new museum. All pictures/photos must be identified as to location, date and names of the individuals in the pictures (who, what when, where). Artifacts of interest include uniforms (particularly boots, belts, covers, insignia); winter gear; anything labeled "Seabee"; anything issued for language and communications in Korea; any memorabilia from any of the "K" airfield sites that Seabees built including equipment, flags, artwork, plaques, native gifts, "C" rations, menus, posters, etc.; and travel documents. 



#### Reflections.....


We had four children---two boys, two girls. Three of the four were born in naval hospitals scattered around the world. Our first child, a daughter, Carmen, was born in North Africa ---Morocco to be exact, in 1957. A short year later, son John Jr. was born in Santa Monica, California, as I was overseas at the time. During a September hurricane in 1961, son Timothy was born at the naval hospital in Davisville, In January 1963, daughter Rhode Island. Marjorie was born at the naval hospital, Port Hueneme, California.

We used to tease the kids over the years that military record keeping, haphazard the way it was at times, we probably got someone else's kids as they were so much different from one another. I suppose if you are parents yourselves, you can relate to those times when you are told things, after the fact, when you may comment, "you didn't really do that, did you?" Most times though, aren't we pretty proud of our kids? I know I have been over the years.

Recently, I asked Scott Williams about an old MCB 2 shipmate by the name of Ketels. I asked Scott if Yung Ketels and Hark Ketels were the same person. He said they were. Less than a month after that conversation, the wife and I were doing some closet cleaning and we came across a box of old photos and stuff that belonged to the kids. They hadn't been broken out of those boxes in years. Aged and yellowed for the most part, but still legible and well preserved. In one of the boxes, we came across a photo of son John and Yung Ketels, who was then serving as Security Officer at Port Hueneme. There was a letter of congratulations from Yung to John dated 4 November 1971. It seemed that John had found \$10.00 over at the Navy Exchange and his mother had taken him to the base security office and turned it in. John always remembered that event, and even though his siblings teased him about it, he held to his guns that he would have done it even if his 10

Mother hadn't made him do it.

I remember this event being recalled again in the summer of 1996. John was terminally ill from the ravages of AIDS. He was living at home and we were caring for him. There were days when John and I would sit and talk as we had never talked before. We talked of life's fickle finger--we talked of fools and kings---we talked of family and the way things might have been. John recalled to me that he had always tried to be honest in all his dealings with people. laughed about that time when he was a kid and turned that money in to the base security and how he was called back a month later to have it presented to him. John succumbed to that dreaded disease short weeks later during the terrible summer heat of July 1996. I have asked Scott to print this story about John and Mr. Ketels. That's what John always knew him as, and also the photo and what Yung wrote to John that time so long ago. Memories...
