We then shipped out to Port Hueneme for advanced training. In February 1944, we left for Tarawa via Pearl Harbor to form a convoy of three Liberty ships and two destroyer escorts. Now, about the pictures: The heavy equipment group of CBMU 577 reclaimed the D-8 Caterpillar 'dozer from the lagoon where it was abandoned during the landing, either by the Seabees or Marines at our island of Buota "Ella", which was twenty miles down the atoll from Betio where the main battle was fought. This equipment went with us to Eniwetok. I was in the picture on the D-8 Cat and in front of the dump truck. **Scott**, you are doing a great job and it is appreciated by everyone more than you realize. My thanks again goes out to you [thank you very much, Verle]. .....from Ben Pedrotti: [Ben ordered three more caps] Maybe I should be your west coast rep for Seabee hats! Ha! Thanks [enclosed a check]...... from **Bob McMillan**: Enclosed are some photos from CBMU 101 at K-6 Korea (see page 9). I have written info on the back of most of the pictures except the ones with all the water. # Important Notice for RV Parking at Palace Station:

The Palace Station has given permission to park in their open parking lot at no charge for those attending the reunion that drive RVs. 



## john's angels

while many crumble under the weight of a tragic loss, some use their pain to help others. Since the death of his son, John Jr., in 1996 to AIDS, John Wilborn has been giving away wooden carvings he calls John's Angels, as encouragement to others.

"It's my way to maintain sanity—just telling people about my son," says the 71-year-old retired Navy Seabee and plumber.

John's Angels began as a humble sketch drawn by Wilborn's wife while the couple's son stayed at Hospice of the Valley. Her simple design was etched into stone by a family friend and hung in John's memory at the care facility. "The hospice had angels that were made of wood, glass and paper hanging everywhere," Wilborn explains. "I wanted to leave an angel there for John."

The first were rustic wall-hangings, but since have evolved into sculptures made of stained walnut, maple and cherry wood standing 12 inches high. Wilborn mounts each angel on a panel in the shape of a cross, the Star of David or two hearts. The pieces are never sold; however, donations can be made to Hospice of the Valley in John Jr.'s name.

Almost 10 years later, Wilborn estimates he has sent a couple of thousand angels all over the world to people he may never hear from or meet. "There isn't a week that goes by that I don't send one out to a distant location," he notes. His creations also have been sent to celebrities Bette Midler, Elton John and Oprah Winfrey. Recently, newscaster Tom Brokaw was sent an angel and responded with a personal note of thanks.

Wilborn explains, "They're just pieces of wood when they leave my hand, but there are so many different reactions from people. They tell stories that would astound you. I have been uplifted by other people's stories."




