Or would you want a Soldier--His home, his country, his kin, Just a common Soldier, Who would fight until the end.


He was just a common Soldier, And his ranks are growing thin, But his presence should remind us We may need his like again.

### Minutes of the General Membership Meeting October 3, 2009 Sands Resorts Myrtle Beach, SC

Meeting brought to order by Cdr. Pete Elliott at 9:13 a.m. Pledge of Allegiance led by Cdr. Elliott

Cdr. Elliott welcomed all members and guests.

Cdr. Elliott recognized all Staff members present. Rich Nelson and Roy Peak were not present.

Cdr. Elliott suspended the reading of the previous minutes from St. Louis. Secretary Scott Williams noted that the motion that was made, seconded and voted unanimously in favor in St. Louis to change our Articles of Incorporation dissolution clause to indicate that our remaining cash assets will be distributed to the Fallen Seabee Scholarship Fund of the Seabee Memorial Scholarship Association has been done.

Cdr. Elliott asked for a financial report from the treasurer, Scott Williams. Scott Williams told all that we are solvent and all bills have been paid, including for this reunion. We will close the books after the reunion in the black.

Cdr. Elliott announced that the Executive Committee has no recommendation for our next reunion but did state that it should be on the west coast. Cdr. Elliott noted that Bill Hilderbrand presented the latest news on the museum in Port Hueneme two days earlier. Rex Roark made a motion to hold our 2011 reunion in Port Hueneme, seconded by Richard Muns. Discussion on the motion: John Petronka asked what other sights are to be seen near Port Hueneme and Bob Elder said he has been to the Reagan Library, which is just a few minutes away. Cat Borys noted that a tour of the Port Hueneme base would be interesting to see the changes since we were there in the '50s. Rex Roark made a motion to also consider Portland, seconded by Joe DeFranco. Richard Muns suggested a vote be made to select two choices. John Petronka made a motion to select Seattle, seconded by Ralph Heitt. Bill Knight called the question and to select a primary city with a secondary as back-up. The recommendation as primary is Port Hueneme and secondary city is Seattle. Vote taken on the question was unanimous in favor of Port Hueneme, with Seattle as standby. Scott will check on museum progress 12 to 14 months out to determine if there has been satisfactory progress to continue our reunion in Port Hueneme.

Cdr. Elliott announced that all present officers are willing to continue serving in office and asked for nominations from the floor or a motion. A motion was made by Bill Knight to continue with the present officers, seconded by Richard Muns. The vote was unanimous in favor. Motion carried. The officers for 20010/2011 are Pete Elliott, Commander; Roy Peak, Vice-Commander; Scott Williams, Secretary/Treasurer/Newsletter Editor and Publisher.

As noted by Bill Hilderbrand, our museum pledge has been met and exceeded but anyone that would like to make future contributions to the museum, please do so and note the contribution is through the MCB 2 Reunion Association. 



