Sept. 23rd 1949 - LST 1136 beaches on Moen Isl. to build the Trust territory Headquarters





No evidence of Quonset huts, USN grey busses, beer halls, cats, or CE's hanging from poles anywhere on the Island. Paved 4 lanes highways takes you around the island. It has become a popular vacation spot for all nations. The **Chicago** of the Pacific is alive and doing very well.

Goleta CA bombed on Feb, 23, 1942 (73 yrs ago)

Goleta was a small community north of Santa Barbara. Now they are side by side. (Just north of Ventura & Oxnard). It was 7pm DLST that evening in the Wheelers Inn & Service Station (built in 1929) where several locals met over coffee & to listen to **President Roosevelt's** fireside chat. As he finished; from a Japanese I-17 submarine, a 5 inch deck guns fired on the Ellwood petroleum Pier and the adjacent **Barnsdall-Rio Grande** Oil installation. The Japanese gunners were missing their targets. The small gathering in the Inn went outside to see the gunners on deck. Not doing well they submerged. Very little damage & no one was hurt. All this in about 20 minutes.

This was a landmark facility on the Central Coast appearing in the movie "The postman always rings twice".

Today the Station tower is located in the City court. This small station was the flagship station for the **Barnsdall & Rio Grande Oil CO.** It reflected the sophisticated architectural tastes of Heiress **Aline Barnsdall** and Santa Barbara's Mission Revival theme. In the 40's Goleta was a road side stop on the coast highway on your way south to Port Hueneme, CA.

Nov. 18th 1949 Typhoon issue No deaths, Camp Witek hardest hit, Bowling Alley collapsed. All made the headline of the Guam News. The weather station reported winds up to 110 knots.



Buildings collapsed, trees uprooted, debris all over the island made for a major cleanup effort by all units on the Island.
