USS Gerald Ford Carrier CV15-78 Class Super Carrier - AKA Ford Class

This is the largest Naval Ship ever built, the first of the new Super carriers - 1,106' long-256 feet wide - 25 decks tall – 100,000 tons, an Icons on the Seas A crew of 508 officers, 3,780 crew. She will carry 75 planes/helicopters plus. 5 acres of Flight deck. She is nuclear powered with 4 - 30 tons props. Top speed classified. Construction began on Aug. 11, 2005. Cost; \$ 10 billion to build + 4 billion for research. Over 5000 workers worked on this carrier in the shipyards – Newport, RI "A floating City"
