History of the **Purple Heart**

The award known

as the **Purple Heart** has a history that reaches back to the closing days of the American Revolution. The Continental Congress had forbidden General George Washington from granting commissions and promotions in rank to recognize merit. Yet Washington wanted to honor merit, particularly among the enlisted soldiers. On August 7, 1782, his general orders established the Badge of Military The **Purple** Heart is a United States military decoration awarded the name in the President to those wounded or killed while serving, on or after April 5, 1917, with the U.S. military. The Purple Heart is the oldest military award still given to U.S. military members - the only earlier award being the obsolete Fidelity Medallion. The National Purple Heart Hall of Honor is located in New Windsor, New York

These are the requirement for today's Seabees. (STEM =Science –Technology-Engineering – Math). The Seabees of the future will require greater skills in a world of a growing technology. The types of combat skills performed by Sea-Bees include: Chemical, Biological, and Radiological (CBR) response including individual and unit protection and decontamination. They coordinate disaster recovery teams (DRT) and airfield damage repair (ADR) teams and also perform camp security. They will build obstacles to prevent base or camp destruction, stand guard duty in observation posts, go on patrols with squad / platoon sized elements, and drive in convoys. Seabees are small arms qualified as well as crew served weapons systems and trained in advanced first aid. All 7 ratings are appearing in future issues of your NEWSCASTER.

Engineering Aid

<u>The EA:</u> Assist construction engineers in developing final construction plans. They conduct land surveys; prepare <u>maps</u>, sketches, drawings and blueprints; estimate costs; perform quality assurance tests on common construction materials such as soils, concrete and asphalt; and perform other engineering technician functions.



The duties performed by EAs include:

- conducting location surveys for roads, airfields, pipelines, ditches, buildings, drainage structures and waterfront construction;
- preparing hydrographic, topographic and triangulation drawings and maps;
- computing the volume of bulk materials (concrete, bituminous mixtures and earthwork) from drawings and specifications;
- laying out all types of construction work;
- operating and maintaining various types of precision surveying and laboratory test instruments and equipment;
- preparing architectural, mechanical, electrical, and civil drawings and sketches;
- designing grading and drainage systems;
- conducting concrete, soil and asphalt tests;
- conducting quality control inspections for all types of construction projects;
- prepare network analyses, charts and graphs;
- reading and interpreting blueprints and preparing sketches for projects;
- making estimates of material, labor, and equipment requirements.

Working Environment

EAs may work in a variety of conditions, independently or as members of a large team. Their many different duties may be performed in climates ranging from tropical to arctic.

Construction Electricians - CE

The CE's are first responsible for the producing the electric power needed to build and operate airfields, roads, barracks, hospitals on other needed buildings on a base or forward operating base. Construction Electricians build, maintain, and operate power production facilities and electrical distribution systems for Naval installations. The Construction Electrician enlistment tour is a <u>5 year program</u> mainly due to the long school required to make competent Construction Electricians

The duties performed by CEs include:

- installing, maintaining and repairing <u>telephone systems</u> and high and low voltage electrical power distribution networks, both overhead and underground;
- splicing and laying cables, erecting poles, stringing wires and installing transformers and distribution panels;
- installing, repairing and maintaining street lighting, fire alarm, public address, inter-office and telephone switchboard systems;
- installing, maintaining and repairing interior wiring for lighting and electrical
 equipment; working with batteries, electric motors, relays, solenoids and switches;
 operating electrical generators; reading and interpreting blueprints and preparing
 sketches for projects; making estimates of material, labor, and equipment requirements.
