Top stories of the week

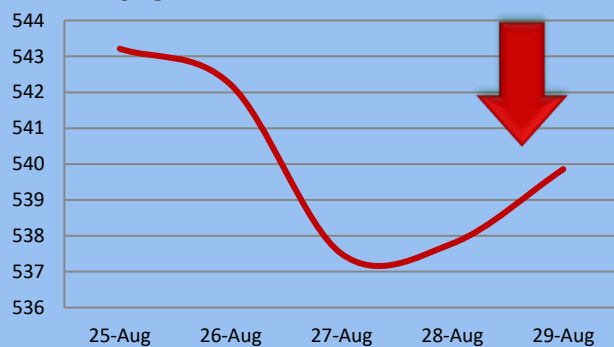
➤ Bunker prices mostly advanced globally on Friday, with Ship & Bunker's G20-VLSFO Index gaining \$2/mt to \$531/mt, its highest level since August 26. While the G20-HSFO Index slipped slightly, the G20-MGO Index jumped by \$3.50/mt. VLSFO prices followed a positive trend at most top bunkering ports, including Singapore and Houston, occurring even as ICE Brent crude futures declined slightly to \$67.48/bl.

➤ An attack on a commercial ship in the Red Sea was confirmed after an initial report of a projectile landing near a vessel 40 nautical miles south-west of Yanbu. Yemen's Houthi movement claimed responsibility for launching a missile that made a direct hit on the tanker Scarlet Ray. Although the crew was reported safe, the attack reaffirms the ongoing threat that diverts shipping away from the Suez Canal.

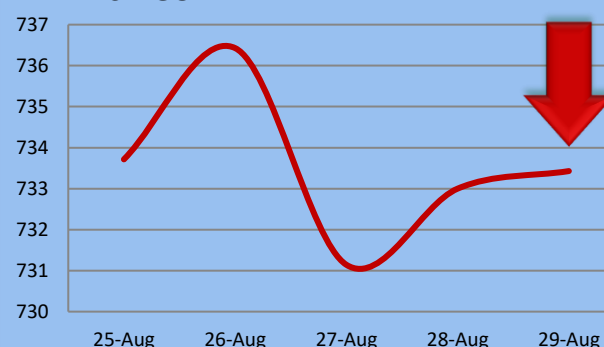
➤ Off Singapore's east coast, a collision between the tanker Marine Dynamo and the bulk carrier Flag Gangos resulted in a minor MGO spill. The incident occurred about 8 km south of Tanah Merah. All crew were safe, except for one crew member on the Marine Dynamo who sustained minor injuries. The Maritime and Port Authority of Singapore deployed patrol craft, confirming no impact to navigational safety as the spill is expected to dissipate naturally.
