Tips to improve your success on the water

ADDING AN INDICATOR TO THE NYMPH RIG

Tight line nymphing is a great way to catch fish in Southeastern waters year-round. But it isn't always the most effective technique for targeting fish feeding under the water. For example, anglers should consider switching to indicator nymphing when pursuing spooky fish in gin-clear water or when fishing across multiple current seams.

INDICATOR TIME?

- You need to present a fly farther away than can be tight-lined without line sagging or laying on the water.
- You know your fly will travel through multiple currents. Anglers can get longer drag-free drifts while fishing across multiple current seams by mending their line up or downstream (depending on stream conditions).
- It is windy and your line bows excessively, making it hard to maintain contact. Wind makes it harder to register strikes and, in extreme conditions, may even create drag by pulling the fly through the water.
