

# BLEASBY LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY AIRCREW MEMEORIAL

### STEAM TRAIN EXTRAVAGANZA

**20TH AUGUST 2016** 



During 1941 to 1943, nineteen young men died in three aircraft crashes in Bleasby. Four from Poland, flying a Wellington with the 304 (Polish) Squadron RAF, crashed near Bleasby Primary School.

The other men were in two Lancaster

bombers- one returning from an air raid over Germany, and the other on a training flight. Their aircraft collided just north of Bleasby. One airmen was from Canada, two from Australia, and one from Eire.


Plans are now being developed to construct a

memorial in Bleasby to commemorate these young men. The target date for completion is 1st September 2018, and the likely cost is £6,000 to £8,000.

Funds have been raised from a variety of projects, and we are planning a major event this Summer - a day out at the Great Central Railway in Loughborough. We will dine in 1950s style, travelling in Pullman Car comfort, complete with a five course meal. The train will be pulled by a steam locomotive, driven by Bill Brazier, a long time Bleasby resident. Travel from Bleasby will be by coach, leaving from the Waggon and Horses.

We are now taking bookings for this excursion - Adults £75 (including a donation of £20 for the project). Children £35 (no donation).

# It's all happening at Newark and Sherwood!

At the end of March, the
District Council opened an
extension to our new
National Civil War Centre
which links it to the
Palace Theatre and which
houses a re-located
Tourist Information
Centre.

The refreshment area in the Palace Theatre has also been re-vamped and is now a very attractive place to relax over a coffee or a light snack. Do give it a try.

Then, in late April, we opened our new £9.4m Sports and Fitness Centre (leisure centre to you and me!!) on Bowbridge Road, Newark. It replaces the time-worn Grove Leisure Centre but is 60% bigger and has an 850 sq m state-of-the-art fitness

suite, a six lane 25m main pool and a 20m learner pool, two squash courts, a sports hall and a dance studio. It's well worth a visit.

And, if that isn't enough. construction has just started on our new offices adjacent to Newark Castle station. On completion next Summer, their running costs will be around £500,000 p.a. lower than at Kelham Hall - a saving that will help us protect front-line services. In addition to the District Council, the offices will be home to Job Centre Plus, the Citizens'Advice Bureau and other public bodies so as to provide a 'One-Stop'customer service point.

In combination, these three projects amount to a £20m investment in our local economy, providing

Dementia is complex, and coping mechanisms vary from person to person, but pivotal to an individual's quality of life, is the presence of an active support network.


Last year, my staff and I were trained as 'dementia friends' and embarked on

Is it time for us to think about improving the appearance of our village?

The village does look a bit neglected. Many of the verges need maintenance, hedges need trimming and even the road signs are looking unloved.

Rolleston originally housed a small functional farming community so appearance was less important. It has grown into a village with lots going on and really good facilities such as the Village Hall, The Crown / Gurkha One and the Children's Playground. Should we now look at the way the village presents itself?

Certainly we would not want to spoil the traditional rural character of Rolleston and make it into a "chocolate box" village, but perhaps it just needs a good tidy up, a bit of TLC.




Then, to close the day, Tapas were provided by Jamil of Gurkha One – very enjoyable after a busy day. Thank you Jamil.

# News from SUE SADDINGTON

our County Councillor

Following the Nottinghamshire County



Council budget in February, there was nearly a 4% rise in Council Tax; 2% for normal spend and 2% ring fenced towards Social Care.

We still have our County Councillors Divisional Fund to help towards village projects and I have be able to help with funding towards the Village Fun Day and given funding towards the play park.

I shall continue to hound Highways England to progress improvements to our major junctions, as travelling around Newark appears worse every day.

We have addressed the installation of the new directional signs to the racecourse which will hopefully prevent most race goers using Station Road.

We are also expecting railway crossing closures later in the year and as plans become clearer, will let you know.

The Local Minerals Development Plan and Flash Farm has taken up a lot of time. We continue to make our concerns clear as to why this site is unsuitable. Submission will be brought to the Environment and Sustainability Committee on September 22nd.

As from 1st July, the maintenance of our roads will be carried out by a specialist highways contractor, VIA. They will be overseen by the NSDC team at Kelham Hall, and if you wish to report a problem, please phone 0300 500 8080.

Many residents now have a better broadband service but I shall continue to request the same for villages who still experience a poor service.

I look forward to continuing to work with the Parish Councillors to achieve improvements to village life and undertake projects, without which the village would be much the poorer.



Details of Parish Councillors Roles and Responsibilities, and contact details have been posted on the PC notice board.

We would like to thank Carol Jennings and Lynda Ogilvie for acting as temporary clerks and hope to appoint a permanent clerk soon.

We are still awaiting a planning decision on the Southwell Racecourse Flood Alleviation Scheme and the quarry at Flash Farm, Averham. Councillors Blaney and Saddington have been very supportive to our observations and objections.

Plans for making Rolleston and Staythorpe level crossings automatic are still in the pipeline. Our latest information is Oct / Nov 2016. This will cause considerable traffic disruption and once we receive firm details we let you know.

Negotiations are still taking place with NSDC over the transfer of Corner Farm land to the PC.

We are working with the NSDC dog warden to stop dog fouling in the village, around the Village Hall and on the 2 acre play area. Thank you to all responsible dog owners and to the less responsible, please think of the consequences of not clearing up dog poo.

We have a number of people in the village with mobility problems and using prams and pushchairs. Please help them by, as far as possible, not parking on pavements and by cutting overhanging hedges.

Finally, thanks for the support which villagers give to the PC.

# Spring has arrived in the allotments!!



Artichokes have been harvested, potatoes planted, onions set and Bob's bees have arrived. All is good.

The site looks lovely, many of the trees and bushes are in bloom; apples, pears, cherries, blueberries and raspberries all coming on nicely. We have two very professional "allotmenteers" and their plots look like something out of the Chelsea Flower Show!

Our important news is that we finally have a borehole that works. Many thanks to Ian Whitehead for organizing this. We are now positive about the water supply and feel prepared for the coming summer.

One member of the group is having a go at being self-sufficient with his water supply, using a simple system of cut off plastic bottles planted at the root of his crops. A tip

that can be used by more of us and possibly in our gardens too. Compositing has been going on too. How vegetable kitchen waste, grass cuttings and weeds can be turned into compost with the help of a few worms is amazing.

Our next project is erecting a donated shed in the car park area. We hope this will

become a shared area for seed sharing, tips, and our notice board. We've set a few dates to be social with our own barbeque. (Next year we might be able to provide the meat if the jokes of keeping a pig become a reality!)

As we enter our third year, it is impressive to see how far we have come. A determination to experiment, have a go and try something new is

always apparent. From those who arrive with



the 5 year old children and those of us who bring our retired parents for a bit of light digging, the atmosphere is always friendly, funny, and

supportive. You couldn't ask for more!

All the other children's school fees are being paid for as well, and we hope that some will be able enough to follow Isaac.

Marian I met 3 years ago as a 4/5 year old found wandering the local dirt tracks. She



possessed only what she wore above her bare feet! We took her in, clothed her and the smiling joyful face transformed her sad situation. She is in school and doing well. It's a good news story that is ongoing. Thanks to those who contributed at the last Christmas concert.

## **CLAIRE'S CORONATION CHICKEN**

As the nation celebrates the Queens 90th birthday I thought it would be nice to re-visit this old favourite. It was created in 1953 to be served at the Queen's coronation lunch and has appeared on buffet tables ever since.

It is called **Chicken Elizabeth** in my old recipe folder, together with a recipe for a vegetable and rice salad called **Rice Philippe!** 



Here is my simple version of this dish for everyone to enjoy, it serves approx. 6 people, any left-overs are great in wraps or sandwiches.

### **Coronation Chicken**

6 skinless chicken breasts - poached in water with a chopped up carrot, onion and seasoning until tender (20 mins approx.)

Leave to cool in the liquid then pull or cut into bite-sized pieces.

#### For the sauce:

Combine 4 tblsp mayonnaise, 4 tblsp crème fraiche or greek yoghurt, 2tsp medium curry powder, 2 tblsp mango chutney and the juice of half a lime.

Taste this and add more curry and chutney to taste, if the sauce is too thick a spoon or two of the cooking liquid can be added to loosen it a little.

Gently stir in the chicken and pile onto a serving plate, garnish with wedges of lime and a few torn-up coriander leaves if you like.



You can make the chicken a day ahead and store in a container in the fridge if like, in fact the flavours improve overnight so perfect when entertaining.

## OUR ROLLESTONIANS



### Abs Chaaban

Abs was born in Lebanon, a beautiful country, but not, at that time, due to the on-going civil war, an easy place to live. Abs already had an uncle settled in London so in 1993, aged 22, he decided to join him.

Initially working in a restaurant, he studied painting and decorating whilst getting used to his new country. London was quite a shock to the young Abs - busy, bustling, noisy and affluent. It was a far cry from the country that he had left behind; for example it gave Abs the opportunity to visit a night club for the first time!


