How will it happen?

- Rolleston Parish Council secured £3124 to complete the plan from the Countryside Agency
- Want to set up a Steering Group to guide the process forward
- NRCC have been asked to give consultancy support to the Steering Group.

Next steps

- · Develop a village appraisal for the village
- · Deliver and collect from every home
- NRCC analyse the data and produce a report
- · Information gathering open days
- Action planning
- · Production and consultation of draft Plan
- · Completion of final Plan.
