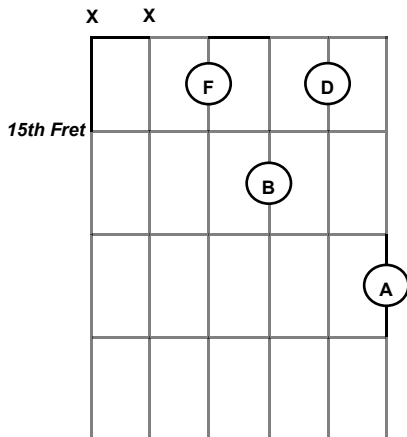


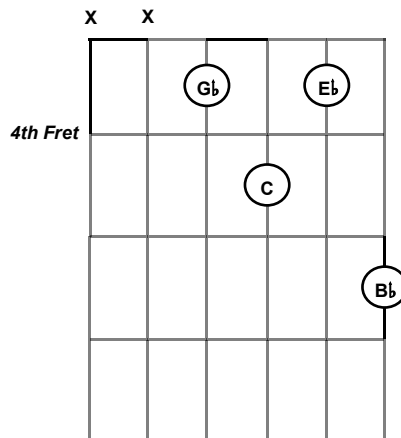
The  $A\text{m}7\flat 5$  chord can be played on either the 1st or 13th fret. It is played without the 5th and 6th strings. This is represented by "X." When we slide the  $A\text{m}7\flat 5$  up the neck of the guitar, it changes names.

### $B\text{m}7\flat 5$



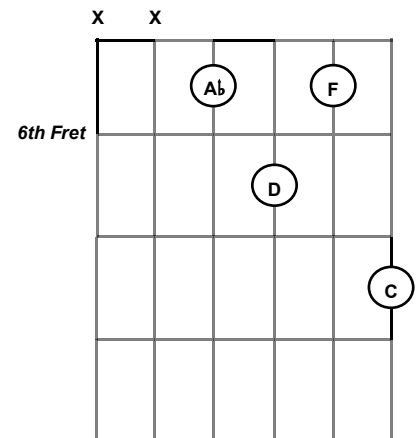
### $C\text{m}7\flat 5$

Can be played on either the 4th or 16th fret.



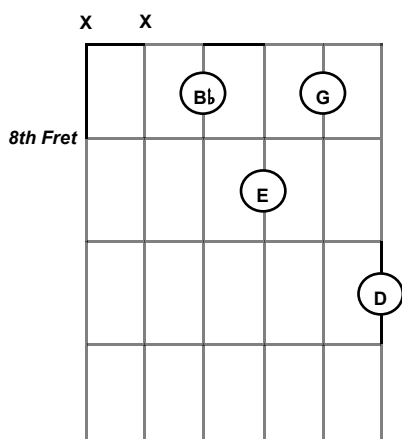
### $D\text{m}7\flat 5$

Can be played on either the 6th or 18th fret.



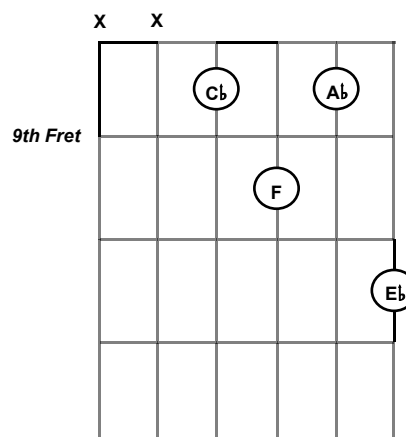
### $E\text{m}7\flat 5$
