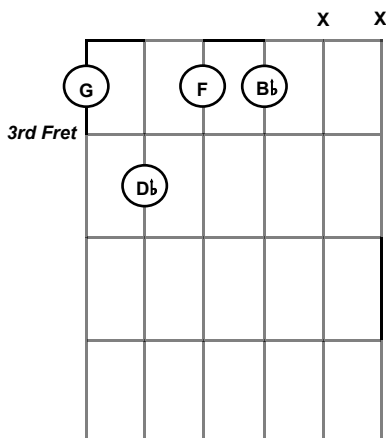


The Fm7 $\flat$ 5 chord can be played on either the 1st or 13th fret. It is played without the 1st and 2nd strings. This is represented by "X." When we slide the Fm7 $\flat$ 5 up the neck of the guitar, it changes names.

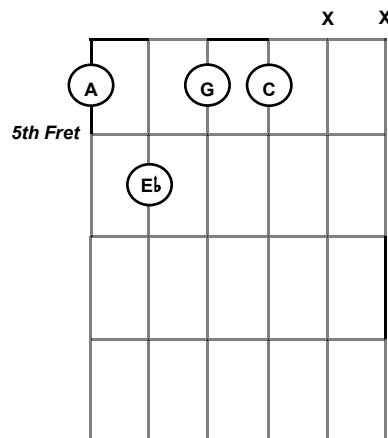
### Gm7 $\flat$ 5

Can be played on either the 3rd or 15th fret.



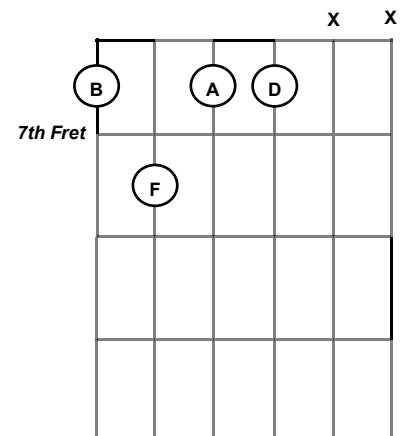
### Am7 $\flat$ 5

Can be played on either the 5th or 17th fret.



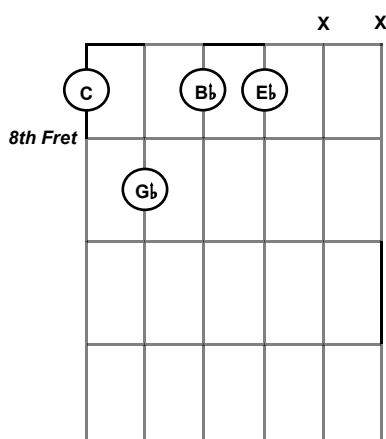
### Bm7 $\flat$ 5

Can be played on either the 7th or 19th fret.

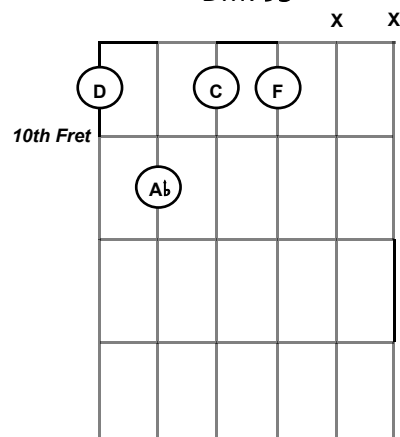


### Cm7 $\flat$ 5
