


The Dm7b5 chord is displayed to the left. It is played without the 5th and 6th strings. This is represented by "X." When we play the Dm7b5 on the 12th fret, we use the same configuration as the chords shown below. When we slide the Dm7b5 up the neck of the guitar, it changes names.


Em7**b5** 

Can be played on either the 2nd or 14th fret.




Fm7**b**5

Can be played on either the 3rd or 15th fret.




Gm7**b5** 

Can be played on either the 5th or 17th fret.




Am765
