


The  $E\flat 5$  chord can be played on either the 3rd or 15th fret. It is played without the 5th and 6th strings. This is represented by "X." When we slide the  $E\flat 5$  up the neck of the guitar, it changes names.


### $F\flat 5$

Can be played on either the 4th or 16th fret.




### $G\flat 5$

Can be played on either the 6th or 18th fret.




### $A\flat 5$

Can be played on either the 8th or 20th fret.




### $B\flat 5$
