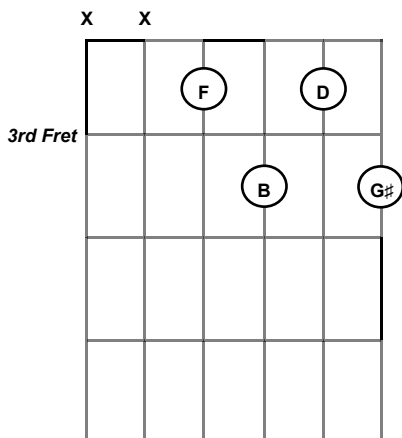


The D7 \flat 9 chord can be played on either the 1st or 13th fret. It is played without the 5th and 6th strings. This is represented by "X." When we slide the D7 \flat 9 up the neck of the guitar, it changes names.

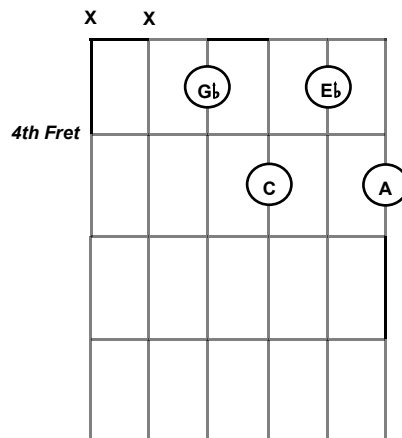
E7 \flat 9

Can be played on either the 3rd or 15th fret.



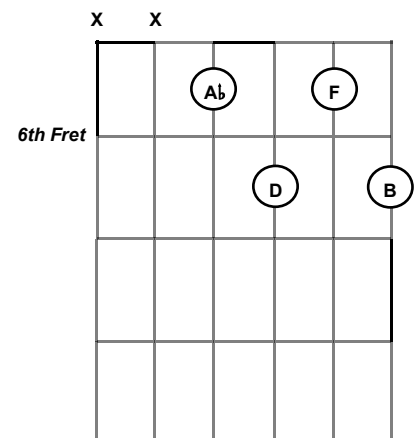
F7 \flat 9

Can be played on either the 4th or 16th fret.



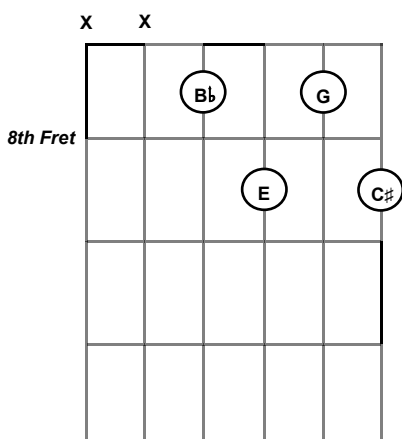
G7 \flat 9

Can be played on either the 6th or 18th fret.



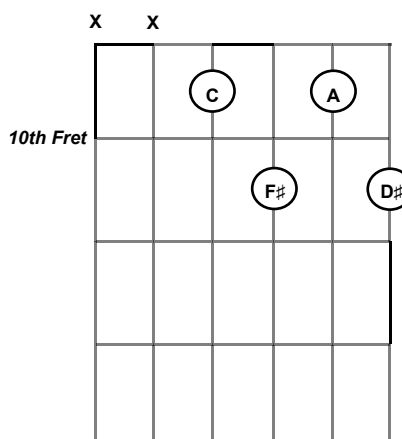
A7 \flat 9
