

Healing Paws Cat Sanctuary is a 501c3 Nonprofit that started out as an all-feral cat sanctuary that specialized in feral that can no longer live in the wild due to health/ disabilities /behavior issues and elderly. We have had such a HUGE outpouring we have relocated and are expanding our sanctuary so we can offer not only feral cats a safe place but also domestic cats and livestock that suffer from the same issues. Here they live out the remainder of their lives where they are monitored 24/7 by a trained medical staff member.

The sanctuary offers a 3.5-acre free roam living facility with several shelters and a pond surrounded by a seven foot no climb fence system to offer safety and security for all that call us home. The sanctuary is also equipped with seperate quarantine and hospitalization areas for those just coming to us or with medical needs. We also offer a separate safe area for feline leukemia and aids cats. Here they will also be able to free roam in their very own outdoor area without encountering other cats.

We are also HUGE TNR advocates (trap-neuter-release) which is dedicated to humanely reducing the feral and stray cat population in our area. We hope to be able to implement a TNR program in our new location. Our rescue works to better the lives of all that come into our care.

Sick/injured feral are humanely trapped, evaluated by the rescue, and treated. Once healthy enough they are then taken to the clinic to be TNR'd (spayed/neutered a vaccinated). Our primary goal is to offer care to those feral that would otherwise die in the wild. If it is determined that they can be we will rehabilitate the animal for adoption. ALL our rescuers will have their ear notched when they are fixed. This is so they can be identified as fixed by animal control and other rescues so if they are outside kitties or happen to sneak out if indoor, they will not get picked up as a stray feral.

Through the TNR (trap-neuter-release) program, once healthy kitten/cats that can't be rehabilitated for adoption are either returned to their familiar habitat where they were trapped, are socialized into the colony here at the sanctuary or are adopted out as Barn Kitties to live their lives out doing what they love best ... Hunting. Kittens/cats that are found to have health issues/disabilities are kept here at the sanctuary to live out their remaining nine lives. TNR also helps to cut down on the many diseases that feral cats can carry and transmit to each other such as Feline FIV, Feline FeLV, Feline Distemper and Feline Rabies.

Since opening our doors in 2015 we have been able to help over one thousand of the local feral that otherwise get ignored and we are home to over forty feral with ongoing medical issues. Healing Paws Cat Sanctuary is a huge advocate for the humane treatment of feral, semi-feral and stray cats. TNR Programs offer a humane solution to the overpopulation of cats in our cities.
