




#### INCIDENT/TRANSPORTS HISTORICAL (CY21 numbers are extrapolated from YTD data)





#### **INCIDENTS BY MUNICIPALITY-YTD 2021**


#### **INCIDENT OUTCOME-YTD 2021**




#### **OPERATIONAL TIMES- FEBRUARY 2021**

## **SCCEMS Facilities and Stations**

SCCEMS operates MEDIC 94 units from two stations in our primary service area. Our headquarters and MEDIC 941 station is located in the Jennersville Hospital just off the hospital's emergency department. The station was constructed in 1996 with community funds raised by the former SCCMC for the building of the new emergency room as well as EMS Wing. Since 1983, MEDIC 941 has been operating from the hospital and the small office and single vehicle garage was too small for our growing needs. The station consists of a two bay garage of approximately 900 sq feet and three offices for our MEDIC 941 paramedic the EMS Sergeants and the CEO/EMS Chief. We are fortunate that in 2016, we signed a 10-year lease for \$1/year with the previous owner of the hospital. All indications with the current owner is that they are respecting that lease agreement.



Our Avondale station is in the Avondale Firehouse. We moved into their new station in 2007 after being housed at the New Garden Township Building for several years. The quarters at Avondale consists of an apparatus bay for our MEDIC 942 vehicle and reserve vehicle and an office for the duty paramedic. Our paramedic assigned to the station have full access to the facilities. Our rent agreement with the Avondale Fire Company is for \$16,500/year.
